Project Title: Highland Hills Development Project (Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2018-0217-R6 (Revision 1)

Project Location: The Highland Hills Development Project (project) is located within Cook Canyon Creek, a tributary to City Creek and the Santa Ana River, east of Highway 330 and north of East Highland Avenue, Sections 26, 27, 34, Township 1N, Range 3W in the County of San Bernardino, State of California; Latitude 34.082769, Longitude -117.104413.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2018-0217-R6 (Revision 1), pursuant to section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, First American Title Insurance Company represented by Joseph Tavarez. The project is limited to the construction of a residential development, parks, hiking trails and swales and multi-use basins. Also included are fuel modification zones, and Homeowner's Association maintenance areas. Development is proposed within approximately 221.92 acres, with the remaining property permanently avoided, including 214.58 acres of sage scrub/chaparral, 84.30 acres of scrub/grassland and 8.95 acres of riparian habitat. The proposed project will modify the lower 2,115 feet of Cook Canyon Creek, into a trapezoidal, gabion-walled channel, with an Armorflex bottom. Additionally, the project will conserve, in perpetuity, 18.5 acres of riparian/streambed habitat.
