Project Title: Segment A Phase 1.4 (Streamed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2019-0155-R2)

**Project Location (include county):** The project is located on unnamed tributaries to Steelhead Creek, in the County of Placer, State of California; within Sections 5, 7, and 8 of Township 10N, Range 5E of the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) 'Rio Linda' 7.5-minute topographic quadrangles, California; approximately centered on Latitude 38.741182°N, Longitude -121.461851°W.

**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2019-0155-R2, pursuant to section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, Lennar Winncrest, LLC (Permittee) as represented by Larry Gualco.

The Segment A Phase 1.4 Project is a component of the Placer Vineyards Specific Plan (PVSP), a 5,230-acre specific plan project, which includes onsite and offsite infrastructure elements. The 33.85-acre Segment A Phase 1.4 Project includes the 21.95-acre Segment A Phase 1.4 area as well as an 11.90-acre area that overlaps with other Placer Vineyards Phase 1 permit areas (overlap with Segment Q Phase 1.1, Segment A Phase 1.1, and Segment A Phase 1.2). The activities authorized by this Agreement for the Segment A Phase 1.4 Project include the following: the placement of a soil stockpile including the use of a haul route, and the grading and restoring of proposed open space to make drainage improvements and create wetland habitat. Approximately 21.46 acres of open space will be graded and restored to make drainage improvements and create wetland habitat, which will support wildlife and provide storm water detention/conveyance for storm water. A haul route will be used to move soil from the open space portion of the Segment A Phase 1.4 Project to a soil stockpile (described below), which will be placed within the future development area (Segment Q Phase 1.1) of Property 19.
