Project Title: San Benito Route 156 Improvement Project (Project); California Endangered Species Act (CESA) Incidental Take Permit No. 2081-2015-057-04 (ITP), Amendment No. 1.

Project Location: The Project is located between Post Mile (PM) 3.0 near the City of San Juan Bautista to PM 8.2 west of the City of Hollister in the County of San Benito, located on the United States Geologic Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle map: Bickmore Canyon, Township 12 south, Range 05 east, Section 31, SE Quarter section of the Mt. Diablo Meridian.

Project Description: The Project involves converting the existing 2-lane conventional highway into a 4-lane, divided, controlled-access expressway including placing an asphalt concrete overlay, flattening cut slopes, widening fill slopes, overpass intersections and widening paved shoulders to 5-foot inside and 10-foot outside.

The Project is expected to result in the permanent development of 8.36 acres of upland habitat and temporary impacts to 9.62 acres of upland habitat resulting in a total disturbance of 17.98 acres of California tiger salamander upland habitat. The Project may result in incidental take of California tiger salamander (*Ambystoma californiense*) which is designated as a threatened species under the California Endangered Species Act. Amendment No. 1 referenced above authorizes the extension of the ITP expiration for a four-year period changing the expiration date from December 31, 2019 to December 31, 2023 and modifying the Project Description's construction schedule. The ITP referenced above as issued by CDFW authorizes incidental take of species listed under CESA that may occur as a result of Project implementation.
