Title: Guerneville River Park Project

Proponent: Sonoma County Regional Parks

Location: Sovereign land in the Russian River at Guerneville River Park, adjacent to Assessor's Parcel Numbers 071-160-069 and 071-160-070, near the State Highway 116 Vehicle Bridge, Guerneville, Sonoma County.

Description: The project consists of the three-phased development of a primarily passive type park facility including paved (ADA compliant) and compacted gravel trails, group and family picnic areas, small outdoor stage, small craft boat portage, restroom building, open grass areas, nature study areas and vehicle access and parking, amenities and appurtenances. The State Lands Commission action is an approval of a 25-year General Lease – Public Agency Use through June 22, 2045.
