The Temecula Valley Hospital Master Plan Update (proposed project) consists of revisions to the currently adopted master plan that require a Major Modification and Planned Development Overlay Amendment. The proposed project includes development of a behavioral health building, an emergency department expansion, two hospital towers, two medical office buildings, a utility plant, surface parking lots, and a 4-story parking structure. In addition, the proposed project includes relocation of the existing helipad to the roof of the proposed parking structure. The proposed project is located at 31700 Temecula Parkway in the City of Temecula (project site). The project site encompasses 35.85 acres on Assessor's Parcel Number 959-080-026.
