SUBJECT: De Minimis/No Effect Finding Completed for Original Final Negative Declaration  
(SCH# 2005031180)

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The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) circulated for review an Initial Study and Draft Negative Declaration with De Minimis/No Effect Finding from March 30, 2005 to April 28, 2005. This document was circulated to the California Department of Fish and Game (now the California Department of Fish and Wildlife), who did not provide any comments during the comment period.

After responding to comments received during the comment period, DTSC issued a final permit decision on September 24, 2007. The final issuance concluded that the project would not have a significant effect on the environment, as documented in the September 24, 2007 Final Negative Declaration. After an appeal of the permit decision unrelated and inconsequential to the environmental effects, minor changes were made to the permit's language and a final revised permit was issued, effective May 11, 2009.

DTSC filed its Finding of De Minimis/No Effect as part of the Final Negative Declaration and did not pay a CEQA filing fee when finalizing the decision on the project during that permit cycle.
