Title: American River Watershed Common Features, Water Resources Development Act of 2016 Project, Sacramento River East Levee Contract 1

Proponent: Central Valley Flood Protection Board

Location: Along the east bank of the Sacramento River, Sacramento, CA

Description: The Proposed Project includes the installation of levee improvements to meet embankment and foundation stability requirements. The State Lands Commission action is an approval of a 20-year General Lease – Public Agency Use through August 22, 2042.

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission, as Lead Agency Responsible Agency, approved the above-described project on August 23, 2022, and made the following determinations regarding the project.

- 1) The project will will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2) An Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and Supplemental EIR were prepared and certified pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3) Mitigation measures were were not made a condition of the approval of the project.
- 4) A mitigation reporting or monitoring plan was or was not adopted for this project.
- 5) A Statement of Overriding Considerations was was not adopted for the project.
- 6) Findings were were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.

The lead agency for the project, the Central Valley Flood Protection Board (CVFPB), certified the EIR, Supplemental EIR, and Mitigation Monitoring Program and approved the project on April 22, 2016, and November 22, 2019, respectively. The California State Lands Commission has considered the EIR and Supplemental EIR as prepared for this project by CVFPB. The EIR and Supplemental EIR, and the record of project approval may be examined at the above shown California State Lands Commission Sacramento office address.
