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MS. JARQUE: Good evening. Thank you for coming to the Stone Creek Environmental Impact Report Public Scoping meeting being held at the Mira Mesa branch library. Today is Monday, September 26, 2005, and the time is 5:41 p.m. My name is Anne Jarque with the City of San Diego Development Services Department.

The purpose of this scoping meeting, in accordance with California Environmental Quality Act, is to consult with the public in the early stages of the EIR process to solicit public input from the community to help define the scope of work for the preparation of an Environmental Impact Report, also known as an ERI.

As lead agency under SEQU, the City's Environmental Analysis Section's, EAS, staff has determined an EIR shall be prepared to disclose and identify potentially significant environmental impacts that may result from the development of the Stone Creek project.

Please note that environmental document does not recommend approval or denial of the project and the analysis and conclusions of the EIR shall be based on substantial evidence on the record.

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Now I'd like to briefly go over how the meeting will be conducted. As indicated on the agenda, I will introduce the project by providing a brief description of the proposed development and identify the environmental issues to be discussed in the EIR. Next, the project applicant, Mike LaBarre of Fehlman LaBarre Architects, will give a brief ten-minute presentation of the project's scope. Then we will open the floor for public comment.

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9 As stated earlier, the purpose of the meeting is 10 to get your input on specific environmental issue areas that need to be addressed in the EIR. Each speaker is 11 12 asked to use the microphone provided, verbal comments will be taped and recorded by a court reporter for the public 13 administrative record. Please speak clearly -- as clearly 14 15 as you can so that comments can be accurately recorded. When I call you to speak, please introduce yourself and 16 17 state your address. Each speaker will have three minutes. 18 Please end your comments promptly when you are notified 19 that your three minutes are up. If you have more to say 20 or do not wish to speak tonight and would like to provide 21 written comments on the scope of EIR, please fill out a 22 comment form located at the back of the room and submit 23 them to any City staff by the close of the meeting. 24 Please focus your comments on specific

environmental impacts you would like to see thoroughly

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1 analyzed in the project's EIR so we may incorporate your 2 comments and suggestions in the analysis. 3 Copies of the agenda, notice of preparation and 4 scoping letter and comment forms are located on the table 5 in the back of the room. Before you leave tonight, please 6 remember to sign in so that we have record of your 7 attendance. 8 Please note that if you'd like to be added to 9 the environmental distribution and noticing list for this 10 project, please include your address as well. Lastly, I will close this meeting by 7:30 p.m. 11 12 tonight. If time permits, the applicant and City staff 13 may be available for questions after the meeting. 14 So let me begin by introducing the project. As 15 indicated in the scoping letter, the proposed Stone Creek 16 project will require an amendment to the Mira Mesa 17 Community and Carroll Canyon Master Plan, a vesting 18 tentative map, rezone, a master plan development permit, 19 site development permit, and an amendment to the 20 reclamation plan conditional use permit. 21 The Stone Creek project would develop 22 approximately 50 acres of parks, open space and trails, 23 8,700 residential dwelling units, and 600,000 square feet 24 of industrial business park uses. In addition, the project will also include the development of a 25

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pedestrian-focus mixed-core center that would also provide approximately 100,000 square feet of office space, 30,000 square feet of retail space, and additional housing.

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The project site is currently being used by Vulcan Materials for their ongoing resource extraction operation for the mining and processing of sand and gravel, which operates under an approved conditional use permit. The project site is approximately 300 acres and is located north of Miramar Road, west of Camino Santa Fe, south of Mira Mesa Boulevard, and east of Black Mountain Road within the City of San Diego's Mira Mesa community planning area.

13 EAS staff has preliminary identified the 14 following potentially significant environmental issue 15 areas which must be analyzed in the EIR as described in 16 the scoping letter distributed. The areas of discussion would include land use, transportation, traffic 17 18 circulation/parking, air quality, noise, biological 19 resources, health and safety, cultural resources, 20 hydrology, geology, paleontological resources, public services and facilities, public utilities, energy, 21 22 landform alteration/visual quality/community character, water quality, mineral resources, population and housing, 23 24 socioeconomic impacts, growth inducement, cumulative 25 impacts, and we'll also discuss affects not found to be

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significant.

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Now I would like to introduce Mike LaBarre with Fehlman LaBarre Architects, who will introduce to you the Stone Creek project team and provide a brief description of the proposed project.

6 MR. LaBARRE: Thank you. With us this evening are 7 several members of our project team, including Patty 8 Schreibman, planning advisor working with Vulcan Material 9 Company; Mike Linton also with Vulcan Material Company, 10 vice president of properties and development; Karen Ruggels, environmental consultant. Thank you for being 12 here. I'd just like to add to what has already been 13 presented briefly.

14 THE AUDIOTAPE OPERATOR: You need to stay in front of 15 the mike if you can.

MR. LaBARRE: For those of you in attendance tonight, referring to the 300-acre site plan and aerial photograph, the proposed land use of industrial and business park areas are located on the easterly portion of the property, adjacent to Black Mountain Road and Kearny Villa Road.

In the central portion of the site located along 21 and adjacent to the future Carroll Canyon Road extension 22 23 through the property would be multi-family housing of medium and high density, as well as the village core 24 described earlier. And to the west, west of Camino Ruiz, 25

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1 would be also additional multi-family housing of medium 2 and high density on the western portion. 3 Also indicated on the land use plan is the 4 proposed location of Carroll Canyon Road, as stipulated in 5 numerous SANDAG, City of San Diego, and other published 6 documents, including stipulated in the Mira Mesa Community 7 Plan. Also a portion of this land use plan is the 8 enhancement of Carroll Canyon Creek in an approximate 9 300-foot-wide width as stipulated in the Mira Mesa 10 Community Plan. 11 That concludes our presentation of the project 12 description, and I think we can open it up for public 13 questions. 14 MS. JARQUE: Thank you. We will go ahead and open it 15 up for public comments. Please provide specific comments 16 regarding the scope of the EIR. Remember you will have 17 three minutes to speak. Please speak clearly so that your 18 words can be accurately recorded by your court reporter. 19 Do we have anyone in the audience that would 20 like to speak on the project? 21 No one here. So I guess we can go ahead and 22 close public comment and go ahead and close the public 23 environmental scoping meeting for this project. Your comments will be transcribed, considered by the City staff 24 25 for use in the scope of the environmental document, and be

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1	a part of the administrative record. The applicant may
2	have a few minutes to answer additional questions before
3	the library closes. Thank you and have a good night.
