<u>Project Description</u>: The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), pursuant to authority granted under Cal. Code Regs., tit. 22, division 4.5, Chapter 14, proposes to approve a Closure Plan Amendment for the former ECS Refining Facility. ECS Refining had been permitted to store and treat hazardous waste to reclaim precious and base metals under a Standardized Hazardous Waste Facility Permit that expired on January 8, 2019. ECS Refining filed bankruptcy and ceased operations in 2018. The landowner, Forsyth-Bolin Property Management, LLC, will effect the final facility closure. On January 9, 2020, Roux Associates on behalf of Forsyth-Bolin Property Management, LLC, submitted a request to amend the ECS Refining Closure Plan to address deficiencies previously identified by DTSC.

The Closure Plan amendments specifically include:

- Scrap metal recycling of processing equipment (e.g., furnaces) and decontamination and wipe sampling of processing equipment (e.g., shredders) to be sold for industrial re-use,
- Designated locations for additional wipe sampling of building wall and ceiling surfaces, and designated locations for concrete chip and soil samples throughout the regulated areas,
- Updated wipe, concrete chip, and soil sampling and quality assurance/quality control sample descriptions,
- Updated schedule for closure activities, and
- Updated closure performance standards to use residential health risk-based screening levels, consistent with current closure methodologies.

Administratively, the Closure Plan amendments include updated information to reflect:

- The landowner, Forsyth-Bolin Property Management, LLC, is implementing the final facility closure following the operator's bankruptcy,
- Current contact information in the event of an emergency response,
- Specific content and schedule for the Closure Report, and
- Closure cost funding and progress payments.

As Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), DTSC approved the above-described project on January 17, 2020 and has made the following determinations:

- 1. The project will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 2. A Negative Declaration was prepared for this project pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
- 3. Mitigation measures were not made a condition of project approval.
- 4. A Statement of Overriding Considerations was not adopted for this project.
- 5. Findings were not made pursuant to the provisions of CEQA.
