San José Unified appreciates that the High-Speed Rail Authority may provide funding to help address potential adverse operational noise effects with Alternative 4 that remain after direct mitigation. We also appreciate the flexibility we would have regarding what noise treatments we might consider. We are very unlikely to pursue a soundwall on our property, which the Authority's cost estimate is based on, and it is important to us to be able to determine the most appropriate measures based on the circumstances at the time of implementation. We understand that \$588,000 is all that's likely to be available at this time, but to the extent the amount of funding could potentially be increased if the most appropriate noise mitigation measure when the High-Speed Rail project moves forward costs more than the proposed \$588,000, that would be helpful as well.
