Project Title: Golden Hills Energy Facility Repowering Project [California Endangered Species Act (CESA) Incidental Take Permit (ITP) No. 2081-2014-034-03 Amendment 2 (Amendment)]

Project Location: The project is located approximately 8 miles east of the City of Livermore in Alameda County within the Altamont Pass Wind Resource Area. The project is bounded by Interstate 580 to the north, Patterson Pass Road to the south, Midway Road to the east and North Flynn Road to the west.

Project Description: CDFW received a request for Amendment 2 to ITP 2081-2014-034-03 to authorize additional temporary and permanent impacts associated with the Golden Hills Transmission Line Wildfire Mitigation Project (Wildfire Mitigation Project). The Amendment request also describes the changes to the GHEP-Sweet Ranch aquatic breeding habitat compensation and boundary adjustments with proposed compensation for shortfall at GHEP-Walker Ranch. The Wildfire Mitigation Project is anticipated to result in 11.2 acres of temporary impacts and 0.012 acre of permanent impacts to annual grassland that supports suitable upland estivation and dispersal habitat for California tiger salamander and denning and foraging habitat for San Joaquin kit fox.

The Project is expected to result in the following impact acreages to California threatened species San Joaquin kit fox (*Vulpes macrotis mutica*) and California threatened species California tiger salamander (*Ambystoma californiense*) habitat: an additional 0.012 acres of permanent habitat loss and an additional 11.25 acres of temporary upland habitat loss. The Amendment referenced above as issued by CDFW authorizes incidental take of species listed under CESA that may occur as a result of project implementation.
