It is located on the northeast side of the 241 toll road at Latitude 33°42'21.67"N, Longitude 117°42'40.19"W.

Hicks Canyon Retarding Basin can be found on the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5-minute series El Toro topographic quadrangle and is located in Section 16, Township 5 south, Range 8 west. It is located on the northeast side of the 241 toll road at Latitude 33°44'07"N, Longitude 117°42"56.68"W.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed a Major Amendment to the existing Streambed Alteration Agreement 1600-2011-0326-R5, pursuant to section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Permittee, Orange County Public Works.

Permittee will implement a rotational vegetation and sediment management strategy: maintenance of specific segments of Bee Canyon Retarding Basin and Hicks Canyon Retarding Basin will be conducted on a rotating basis every two years in order to allow for use of the vegetation by sensitive species while meeting the maintenance needs of the basins. The rotational vegetation management will be monitored during the least Bell's vireo nesting season. Finally, Permittee will adopt a Catastrophic Event Sediment Protocol.

This is to advise that CDFW, acting as a Responsible Agency, approved the above described project on 12/14/2020 and has made the following determinations regarding the project pursuant to California Code of Regulations section 15096, subdivision (i):
