The City of Newman (City) relies entirely on groundwater supply for its middle Hexavalent Chromium (Cr6) levels that formerly exceeded the State of Carontaminant Level (MCL) set in 2014, requiring the City to place one well new well, Well 10, northwest of the City that will be drilled to a depth of an aquifers below Corcoran Clay and access water supplies with better water system capacity from existing well sources due to the prevalence of 20" diameter casing, 2500 gallons per minute 200 HP Vertical Turbine, Composite Power Powe	alifornia's Primary Drinking Water Maximum I on standby. The City proposes to construct a oproximately 500 feet – deep enough to tap into or quality characteristics as well as replace lost of Cr6. Specifics of the Well 10 project include: ement grout seal, 1 Million Gallon Tank,

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The Well 10 site is within the NWMP area, adopted in 2017. The NWMP establishes a land use & development framework and identifies needed infrastructure improvements. A new well (and storage tank) site and connecting infrastructure was specifically identified as an infrastructure improvement that would occur within the NWMP area.

The specifics of the Well 10 project, including construction and operation, was assessed for impacts in the Addendum document. There would be no new significant impacts beyond those identified in the NWMP. Mitigation measures applicable to the Well 10 project are identified and included in a Well 10-specific MMRP, which is Attachment A of the Addendum document, including those related to construction-period dust and emissions, noise, biological disturbance, undiscovered cultural resources, and erosion control/stormwater pollution prevention.
