Title: Low-Energy Offshore Geophysical Permit Program (OGPP) Update

Proponent: Occidental College

Location: Offshore waters (to 3 nautical miles) from Mexico border to Oregon border.

Description: The California State Lands Commission has statutory authority, pursuant to Public Resources Code section 6826, to issue geophysical permits in State waters to qualified permittees for the use of low energy geophysical equipment to perform geophysical surveys of the ocean bottom, subject to specified terms and conditions. The California State Lands Commission action is issuing a 3-year non-exclusive geophysical survey permit to Occidental College (A2950).

This is to advise that the California State Lands Commission, as \boxtimes Lead Agency \square Responsible Agency, has approved the above described project on April 27, 2021, and has made the following determinations regarding the project.
