Thank you for including the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) in the environmental review process for the above referenced MND. The Project proposes modifications to an existing educational facility, including the removal of approximately 23,010 square feet of buildings and the addition of approximately 82,940 square feet of school facilities. The new school facilities include the expansion of existing structures, a new Classroom Building, a new Science Building, a new Performing Arts Building, a new Gymnasium Building, and a new Commons Building, for a net increase of 59,930 square feet. Upon buildout of the Project, between 10 and 20 classrooms would be added and the Project Site would consist of 130,053 square feet of school facilities. The Project would not increase Curtis School's 675 student enrollment cap, however, a total of approximately 50 additional faculty and staff members could be hired. The Project would also reconfigure the parking area and athletic fields to eliminate the conflict between students and cars when accessing the fields. A total of approximately 189 marked parking spaces would be provided in the newly relocated surface parking areas. The City of Los Angeles is the Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

The project is located approximately 1,300 feet from the Interstate 405 (I-405) and Skirball Center Drive interchange. From reviewing the MND, Caltrans concurs that the project will have less than significant Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) impacts.

The following information is included for your consideration. The mission of Caltrans is to provide a safe and reliable transportation network that serves all people and respects the environment. Furthermore, Caltrans encourages Lead Agencies to implement Transportation Demand Management (TDM) strategies that reduce VMT and Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions. Thus, Caltrans supports the TDM strategies this project has incorporated, such as providing landscaped pedestrian walkways on-site. Additional TDM strategies that the City may want to consider integrating into this project to further reduce VMT include:

- Require that 80%, rather than 50%, of the 50 new potential staff and faculty members carpool.
- Verify that no more parking than required is provided.
- Reinstitute and expand the busing program that was in operation during 2016-2017.

Also, any transportation of heavy construction equipment and/or materials which requires use of oversized-transport vehicles on State highways will need a Caltrans transportation permit. Caltrans recommends that the project limit construction traffic to off-peak periods to minimize the potential impact on State facilities. If construction traffic is expected to cause issues on any State facilities, please submit the Construction Staging and Traffic Management Plan detailing these issues for Caltrans' review.
