Project Title: San Juan Oaks Specific Plan (California Endangered Species Act Incidental Take Permit No. 2081-2016-036-04 (ITP) Major Amendment No. 1)

Project Location: The Project is located at 3825 Union Road, about 3 miles southwest of the City of Hollister and approximately 1 mile south of the intersection of Highway 156 and Union Road.

Project Description: This proposed project involves the development of 1,084 single family detached residential units, 1,017 of which will form an active adult community and 67 of which will be conventional single-family residential units; a 17,500 square foot (sf.) to 25,000 sf. Amenity Center; a 200 room resort hotel; a 65,000 sf. neighborhood commercial center; and an approximately 4-acre assisted living/skilled nursing/memory care facility with up to 100 beds. The Project would include the creation of a 41.4-acre on-site agricultural preserve and a 153.5-acre off-site agricultural preserve.

Work under the ITP has not yet begun and Major Amendment No. 1 (Amendment) includes several changes to the ITP as originally issued. These changes include, but are not limited to, a modification to the Project impact area acreage, inclusion of phased passive relocation of California tiger salamander, and phasing of the Habitat Management lands requirements and Performance Security. The Amendment also requires submission of As-Built Development Plans upon completion of each Development phase.

The Project will result in impacts to 452.6 acres of California tiger salamander (*Ambystoma californiense*) habitat including temporary impacts to 43.6 acres. The project is expected to result in incidental take of California tiger salamander, which is/are designated as a threatened species under the California Endangered Species Act. The ITP referenced above as issued by CDFW authorizes incidental take of species listed under CESA that may occur as a result of Project implementation.
