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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

ENGEO conducted a phase I environmental site assessment for the Mather South property located northeast of the intersection of Eagles Nest Road and Kiefer Boulevard (Property). The Property is approximately 900 acres in area and is identified by Assessor's Parcel Numbers (APNs) 067-0030-050, 067-0050-057, 067-0090-034, 067-0090-035, and portions of 067-0030-035, 067-0030-036, 067-0030-046, and 067-0030-048.

The Property consists of an inactive portion of the former U.S. Air Force (USAF) Mather Air Force Base. Review of historical records indicate that the Property was used for agricultural purposes beginning prior to 1937 until sometime between 1937 and 1947, when USAF rough graded a runway within the central portion of the Property. Between 1952 and 1961, construction began on the weapons storage area in the central portion of the Property, the small arms firing range in the southwest portion of the Property, Mather Lake in the north portion of the Property, and the golf course to the west of the Property. Construction on the Folsom south canal began between 1967 and 1971. The base officially ceased operations in 1993.

This assessment included a review of local, state, tribal, and federal environmental record sources, standard historical sources, aerial photographs, fire insurance maps and physical setting sources. A reconnaissance of the Property was conducted to review site use and current conditions to check for the storage, use, production or disposal of hazardous or potentially hazardous materials and interviews with persons knowledgeable about current and past site use.

The site reconnaissance and records review did identify evidence of soil and groundwater impairments associated with the use or past use of the Property. A review of regulatory databases maintained by county, state, tribal, and federal agencies found documentation of hazardous materials discharge on the Property and did identify contaminated facilities within the appropriate American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) search distances that would reasonably be expected to impact groundwater beneath the Property.

Based on the findings of this assessment, one Recognized Environmental Conditions (REC) and two historical RECs were identified for the Property.

• <u>REC</u>: Previous soil remediation was performed under RWQCB oversight at the location of two leaking underground diesel storage tanks grouped east of building 18015. According to the no further action letter issued by the RWQCB-Region 5 in 2002, shallow vadose zone soil impacts remain adjacent to the building. A soil boring advanced at the UST site in 2001 identified a perched groundwater zone at 5 feet and the top of the regional groundwater table at 143 feet. A water sample collected from 10 feet exhibited motor oil at 1,300 ug/l. No constituents were detected in the sample from 143 feet. Former monitoring well MAFB-27C was located 1,000 feet south (downgradient) from the USTs, and exhibited no detections when abandoned in 1998, although historically the well exhibited low-level detections of methylene chloride, and oil/grease. Inactive offsite supply well K-9 located 1,000 feet west (cross gradient) of the UST exhibited trace concentrations of TCE from 1979-1981. Vapor



samples collected from vapor monitoring wells exhibited concentrations of chlorinated compounds only, including TCE and PCE. A bioventing/vapor extraction remediation system was operated at the site and reportedly was successful in eliminating leaching concerns. The PCE and TCE impacts were not discussed in detail in the reports.

- <u>Historical REC</u>: USAF identified and evaluated six areas of concern (AOCs) within the Property: 1) 597 (Mather Lake), 2) weapons storage area (includes WP-17), 3) 41-acre suspected ordnance burial area, 4) 601 (includes XE404 and OT-69), 5) XU-400, 6) OT-86. One of the six AOCs that were evaluated by USAF currently has a restriction against residential land use and two additional AOCs may have potential development constraints. The current status of the three priority AOCs is summarized below:
 - AOC 597. Mather Lake was historically used as a practice grenade firing range when the lake was dry in 1977. A geophysical survey to a depth of 1 foot was performed along the accessible portions of the lake and shoreline, which identified only limited amounts of expended small arms rounds. Restrictions against public access along the east and south shorelines are currently being developed by USAF.
 - o OT-69/XE-404. OT-69 consists of an approximately 4-acre natural basin that lies approximately 10 feet below the surrounding grade. The basin was historically used by USAF as a detonation and burn area. XE-404 consists of an approximately 15-acre buffer area surrounding OT-69. Geophysical surveys were performed within the two areas to a depth of 10 feet; and subsequent excavations and mechanical screening of soil removed buried drums, classified aircraft parts, and small arms rounds at depths up to 12 feet. Soil sampling was performed for dioxins and furans, metals, semivolatile organic compounds (SVOCs), perchlorate, and explosives (HMX, RDX, DNT, TNB, TNT). A CERCLA response action resulted in the excavation of the upper 1 foot of soil across the footprint of OT-69. The deed executed in 2000 requires written notification to be provided to USAF prior to any soil disturbance, including residential grading, within OT-69. Additionally, the 2010 Explanation of Significant Differences prohibits residential use, hospitals, public or private schools for minors, and day care centers within OT-69. To date, no formal restrictions have been established for the XE-404 area surrounding OT-69. Field investigations for OT-69 and XE-404 are reportedly complete and the final remedial completion report is pending.
 - OT-86. The roughly 5-acre area was historically used as a small arms firing range. Surface soil sampling identified concentrations of total lead up to 1,660 milligrams per kilogram (mg/kg). Surface soil excavations conducted with OT086 resulted in the removal of approximately 3,200 cubic yards of soil. The established cleanup goal for lead within OT-69 was 130 mg/kg. The deed executed in 2000 requires written notification to be provided to USAF prior to any soil disturbance, including residential grading, within OT-86. The dig notifications listed in the 2000 deed for OT-86 may present an issue, if the deed remains on the chain of title for future residential parcels.



• Historical REC: A 7,500 gallon septic tank was backfilled with pea gravel in 2000 and five associated dry wells currently remain within the weapons storage area (WP-17), between buildings 18080 and 18090. USAF issued a letter in 1990 recommending no further action and the determination was finalized as part of the Record of Decision (ROD) in 1996. Former monitoring well MAFB-27C was located downgradient from the dry wells and exhibited no detections of when abandoned in 1998, although historically the well exhibited low-level detections of methylene chloride, and oil/grease. A soil boring was advanced to a depth of 155 feet immediately adjacent to the dry wells in 1995. Soil samples exhibited detections of methylene chloride and diesel to a depth of 67 feet. A groundwater sample was collected from 150 feet and no constituents were reportedly detected above the reporting limits by the mobile laboratory. The septic tank abandonment letter issued in 2000 states that there is no significant risk to groundwater. During a recent stakeholder meeting a representative for the USAF reported that he is not aware of any historic industrial activities within the weapons storage area that would have generated hazardous waste.

Based on the review of regulatory databases and site reconnaissance, we present information on features of potential environmental concern that were either contained in the databases or observed on the Property. These features were not considered to be RECs. We briefly discuss each feature below:

- In addition to the above-mentioned UST case, five additional diesel USTs were removed from the weapons storage area. Following removal of these five USTs, no remedial actions were deemed necessary. Sacramento County Environmental Management Department issued no further action letters for the five USTs, and the "no further action" (NFA) letters do state that SCEMD must be notified in the event of a change in land use.
- During our phase I ESA site reconnaissance, we identified a seventh AOC consisting of scrap
 metal debris mixed with soil (former exercise area) located east of the golf course. USAF has
 indicated it does not intend to investigate or remediate this AOC. No geophysical surveys
 have been performed for the portions of the Property that are located outside of the six AOCs
 identified by USAF, which comprises a significant portion of the Property.
- The Property is located within an area where there are known regional groundwater impacts associated with offsite portions of the Mather Air Force Base and the Aerojet facility. The magnitude of regional groundwater contamination beneath the Property is relatively limited in extent and would not be considered a constraint for residential development.

ENGEO has performed a phase I environmental site assessment of the Property in general conformance with the scope and limitations of ASTM E 1527-05 "Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments" and USEPA "Standards and Practices for All Appropriate Inquires", 40 CFR Part 312. Based on the findings of this assessment, ENGEO recommends the following:



- 1. We conclude that at a minimum, excavation of shallow soil impacts associated with the former diesel USTs at Building 18015, may be necessary in support of residential land use, following demolition of the building. Additionally, further evaluation of potential vapor intrusion concerns may be necessary for this area subsequent to the additional soil remediation and prior to residential land use.
- 2. We recommend excavating test pits at the former exercise area (ENGEO AOC) to delineate the extent of the buried debris. USAF informed us that workplan approval is not required prior to us performing this work. In advance of future site development, we recommend coordinating with the USAF to develop a contingency plan for managing undocumented debris and/or contamination that may potentially be uncovered during grading operations.
- 3. We recommend performing Site wide surface soil sampling to evaluate concentrations of chemicals of concern in surface soil. USAF informed us that workplan approval is not required prior to us performing this work.



1.0 INTRODUCTION

ENGEO conducted a phase I environmental site assessment for the Property located northeast of the intersection of Eagles Nest Road and Kiefer Boulevard in Sacramento County, California (Figure 1). The approximately 900-acre Property is identified as APNs 067-0030-050, 067-0050-057, 067-0090-034, 067-0090-035, and portions of 067-0030-035, 067-0030-036, 067-0030-046, and 067-0030-048 (Figure 2). The Property is currently occupied by several abandoned former USAF buildings and weapons storage bunkers, a substantial amount of unused open space (grass lands), and a remote control airplane facility.

1.1 PURPOSE OF PHASE I ENVIRONMENTAL SITE ASSESSMENT

This assessment was performed at the request of Mather South, LLC for the purpose of environmental due diligence during property acquisition. The objective of this phase I environmental site assessment is to identify recognized environmental conditions associated with the Property. As defined in the ASTM Standard Practice E 1527-05, a REC is "the presence or likely presence of any hazardous substances or petroleum products on a property under conditions that indicate an existing release, a past release, or a material threat of a release of any hazardous substances or petroleum products into structures on the property or into the ground, groundwater, or surface water of the property".

1.2 DETAILED SCOPE OF SERVICES

The scope of services performed included the following:

- A review of publicly available and practically reviewable standard local, state, tribal, and federal
 environmental record sources.
- A review of publicly available and practically reviewable standard historical sources, aerial
 photographs, fire insurance maps and physical setting sources.
- A reconnaissance of the Property to review site use and current conditions. The reconnaissance
 was conducted to check for the storage, use, production or disposal of hazardous or potentially
 hazardous materials.
- Interviews with owners/occupants and public sector officials.
- Preparation of this report with our findings, opinions, and conclusions.

1.3 LIMITATIONS AND EXCEPTIONS OF ASSESSMENT

The professional staff at ENGEO strives to perform its services in a proper and professional manner with reasonable care and competence but is not infallible. The recommendations and conclusions presented in this report were based on the findings of our study, which were



developed solely from the contracted services. The findings of the report are based in part on contracted database research, out-of-house reports and personal communications. The opinions formed by ENGEO are based on the assumed accuracy of the relied upon data in conjunction with our relevant professional experience related to such data interpretation. ENGEO assumes no liability for the validity of the materials relied upon in the preparation of this report.

ENGEO can also not be held responsible from any and all claims arising or resulting from clarifications, adjustments, modifications, discrepancies or other changes necessary to reflect changed field or other conditions.

1.4 SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ENGEO has prepared this report for the exclusive use of our client, Mather South, LLC. It is recognized and agreed that ENGEO has assumed responsibility only for undertaking the study for the client. The responsibility for disclosures or reports to a third party and for remedial or mitigative action shall be solely that of the Client.

Laboratory testing of soil or groundwater samples was not within the scope of the contracted services. The assessment did not include an asbestos survey, an evaluation of lead-based paint, an inspection of light ballasts for polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), a radon evaluation, or a mold survey.

This report is based upon field and other conditions discovered at the time of preparation of ENGEO's assessment. Visual observations referenced in this report are intended only to represent conditions at the time of the reconnaissance. ENGEO would not be aware of site contamination, such as dumping and/or accidental spillage that occurred subsequent to the reconnaissance conducted by ENGEO personnel.



2.0 PROPERTY INFORMATION

2.1 SITE LOCATION

The Property is located northeast of the intersection of Eagles Nest Road and Kiefer Boulevard in Sacramento County, California (Figure 1). The approximately 900-acre Property is identified as APNs 067-0030-050, 067-0050-057, 067-0090-034, 067-0090-035, and portions of 067-0030-035, 067-0030-036, 067-0030-046, and 067-0030-048 (Figure 2).

2.2 SITE AND VICINITY CHARACTERISTICS

Surface topography includes gently rolling areas and low drainages crossing the property, generally in an east-west direction. Site elevations range from approximate elevation 170 feet Mean Sea Level (MSL) in the east to approximate elevation 130 feet MSL on the western boundary, just south of Mather Golf Course. The site is mapped as Tertiary Laguna Formation (Wagner 1987). The Laguna formation is described as interbedded alluvial gravels, sand, and silt. The gravels and cobbles of this formation are dominated by quartz and the matrix of the gravelly units are finer sediments and generally contain more than 25 percent feldspar. The estimated thickness of the Laguna formation generally exceeds about 60 meters near Oroville and thins to about 20 meters south of Sacramento.

Site-specific groundwater investigations were previously performed onsite. Perched groundwater was encountered at a depth of 5 feet and the top of the regional groundwater table was determined to be at a depth of 143 feet in a soil boring previously advanced at a UST location within the weapons storage area. Groundwater level measurements for six former onsite groundwater monitoring wells are provided in the table below.

We reviewed the Department of Conservation, Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources (DOGGR) web site and map database to determine if any historic oil and/or gas wells were located within the Property. No wells were mapped within 1-mile of the Property.

2.3 CURRENT USE OF PROPERTY/DESCRIPTION OF SITE IMPROVEMENTS

Mather Lake is located on the northern portion of the property, adjacent to the off-site Mather Golf Course. Mather Lake receives inflows from a drainage that crosses over the Folsom South Canal via a concrete bridge, with the lake draining to the west beneath Eagles Nest Road.



In the area south of Mather Lake, there were two wood observation towers and pole mounted power lines crossing the Property in a west east direction, and a collapsed wood building and concrete slab. The structures were associated with the former USAF Base.

Within the weapons storage area, there were nine abandoned buildings, seven concrete/earthen weapons storage bunkers, and two wood/earthen bunkers. Multiple large tree trunks were stockpiled near the southern bank of concrete bunkers. Asphalt roads extended throughout the weapons storage area. Chain link fencing surrounded the perimeter of the weapons storage area.

South of the weapons storage area, an approximately 5-acre portion of the Property is currently leased by remote control airplane enthusiasts. The facility included a small airstrip and two small shade structures.

East of the remote control airplane facility, there was a large basin that was recently excavated as part of the cleanup activities for open burn/detonation area OT-69.

In the southwest corner of the Property, there were several stockpiles that appeared to have been created fairly recently.

A significant portion of the Property consists of open space grasslands with some tree clusters. The open space is not currently used for agriculture purposes. Evidence of past soil disturbance (roads, drainages, stockpiles) was visible throughout the open space area. The Folsom South Canal extends along the east side of the Property and three concrete bridges convey offsite runoff water onto the Property.

2.4 CURRENT USE OF ADJOINING PROPERTIES

The Folsom South Canal borders the site to the east. Kiefer Boulevard defines the southern boundary, and Douglas Road defines the northern boundary. The west side of the Property is bordered by Mather Golf Course, open space fronting the weapons storage area, and Eagles Nest Road. Mather Air Force Base formerly occupied the land west of Eagles Nest Road.

3.0 RECORDS REVIEW

3.1 PREVIOUS ENVIRONMENTAL REPORTS

3.2 PROPERTY RECORDS

3.2.1 Environmental Liens

No environmental liens are listed in the Commitment for Title Insurance documents dated May 10 and May 16, 2011.

3.2.2 Title Report/Ownership

The Title Report lists recorded land title detail, ownership fees, leases, land contracts, easements, liens, deficiencies, and other encumbrances attached to or recorded against a subject property. Laws and regulations pertaining to land trusts vary from state to state and the detail of information presented in a Title Report can vary greatly by jurisdiction. As a result, ENGEO utilizes a Title Report, when provided to us, as a supplement to other historical record sources.

Two separate Commitment for Title Insurance documents, prepared by Commonwealth Land Title Insurance Company, and dated May 10 and May 16, 2011 were provided for our review. The May 10, 2012 document applies to APNs 067-0030-050, 067-0050-057, 067-0090-035, and portions of 067-0030-035, 067-0030-036, 067-0030-046, and 067-0030-048. The Property title is vested in County of Sacramento, a political subdivision of the State of California. The document includes the following deed restriction excerpt:

"9. Terms, Conditions and Provisions of an instrument entitled "Ouitclaim Deed"

The May 16, 2011 document applies to APN 067-0090-034 and lists the Property title as being vested in the United States of America.

We reviewed the County of Sacramento, Quitclaim Deed, dated February 9, 2010. The Quitclaim Deed lists several environmental restrictions, notification and covenants pertaining to know releases of hazardous substances, asbestos liability, remediation responsibilities, and excavation notification.



These Commitment for Title Insurance documents and Quitclaim Deed are included in Appendix D.

3.3 HISTORICAL RECORD SOURCES

The purpose of the historical record review is to develop a history of the previous uses or occupancies of the Property and surrounding area in order to identify those uses or occupancies that are likely to have led to recognized environmental conditions on the Property.

3.3.1 Historical Topographic Maps

Historical USGS topographic maps were reviewed to determine if discernible changes in topography or improvements pertaining to the Property had been recorded. The following maps were provided to us through an EDR Historical Topographic Map Report, presented in Appendix C.

<u>1893 Map</u> – Morrison Creek is mapped within the north portion of the Property. A second creek is mapped in the southwest corner of the Property, with no apparent outlet. Roads are mapped in the present day location of Douglas Boulevard and Kiefer Boulevard. Two additional roads are mapped crossing through the central and northeast portions of the Property.

1902, 1911, and 1916 Maps – Single buildings are mapped in the northwest, east central, and southeast portions of the Property. An unimproved road begins at the west edge of the central portion of the Property and extends east to the east central building. Three intermittent creek drainages are mapped within the Property flowing west to Morrison Creek. Eagles Nest Road is mapped along the west edge of the Property.

<u>1944 and 1954 Maps</u> – The Property is labeled Air Force Base. Mather Lake is mapped in the northwest portion of the Property. The alignment of the unimproved road in the central portion of has been replaced by a southwest northeast trending road, and near the east boundary, it forks to



the north and southeast, extending offsite. This feature appears to be a runway based on aerial photographs. No buildings are mapped within the Property. Several small ponds are mapped adjacent to the intermittent creek in the southwest portion of the Property.

<u>1967 Map</u> – The footprint of Mather Lake is expanded. The golf course is mapped and two buildings are mapped within the golf course, north of Woodring Way. Twelve structures and a oval-shaped road are mapped in the west central portion of the Property in the weapons storage area. A building and berm are mapped in the southwest corner of the Property in the small arms firing range area. In the southeast portion of the Property, a small pond is mapped, adjacent to Sunrise Boulevard.

<u>1975 Map</u> – The Folsom south canal is mapped along the east edge of the Property. An additional building is mapped in the north portion of the weapons storage area.

<u>1980 Map</u> – An additional road is mapped circling the perimeter of the weapons storage area. South of the weapons storage area, a road is mapped extending towards the area of OT-69 and terminates before the drainage. The marshland south of the weapons storage area has reduced in size. Roads are mapped along the perimeter of the gold course and the north and east sides of Mather Lake. The small pond in the southeast portion of the Property is no longer mapped.

<u>1992 Map</u> – The perimeter road previously mapped around the weapons storage area is no longer shown. The road south of the weapons storage area has been extended across the drainage to a mapped pit. A building is mapped at the present model airplane facility.

3.3.2 Aerial Photographs

The following aerial photographs, provided by EDR, were reviewed for information regarding past conditions and land use at the Property and in the immediate vicinity. These photographs are presented in Appendix E.

1937 Photograph: The site is generally undeveloped and appears to be used for non-irrigated farming and cattle grazing. There is a structure located near the current Mather Golf Course clubhouse and what appears to be a cattle feeding/watering area near the eastern central portion of the property. Eagles Nest Road, Kiefer Boulevard, and Douglas Road are all visible in this image.

<u>1947 Photograph:</u> A runway appears to be rough graded beginning north of the weapons storage area and extending northeast across the site. Near the east edge of the Property, a second runway extends in a north to south direction. Marshland is visible south of the west end of the runway and southwest of the intersection of the two runways in the east. The runways are in the same orientation as the main runways on the main Air Force base offsite to the west. Two circular berm areas are visible on the north and south sides of the north tributary of Morrison Creek in the north portion of the Property.

1952 Photograph: The site is essentially unchanged from the previous images.

1961 Photograph: The weapons storage area is under construction at the west end of the runway. The runway is now less defined. Within the weapons storage area, ordnance storage buildings, concrete bunkers and other improvements are visible. The weapons storage area appears to cover a portion of the former marshland area. Mather Golf Course is visible to the northwest along with the dam impounding Mather Lake. Many unimproved roads cross the entire site in both east-west and north-south directions. The small arms range is visible at the southwest corner of the site.

<u>1971 Photograph:</u> The Folsom South Canal is visible at the east boundary of the site along with what appears to be fill (excavation spoils from the canal) spread across large portions of the site. Mather Lake appears essentially in its current state. A large fill area is located just south of Mather Lake trending in a northeast-southwest direction. The Sacramento Rendering Company facility is visible on the south side of Kiefer Boulevard.

1981 Photograph: Additional structures are visible in the central portion of the site supporting the bunker storage area. The radio-controlled airstrip is visible off of Eagles Nest Road. The "open pit" area (AOC 601) is visible in the central portion of the site, south of the concrete bunker area. The Folsom south canal and water bridges bringing the natural drainages across the canal onto the property are constructed.

1993 Photograph: The site is essentially unchanged from the 1981 image.

<u>1998 Photograph</u>: More trees are visible, generally on the southern and eastern portions of the site. The northern California Terminal Radar Approach Control (TRACON) facility is under construction on the north site of Douglas Road.



3.3.3 Fire Insurance Maps

EDR prepared a Sanborn Fire insurance map search for the Property and surrounding properties. EDR reported that no maps were available for the Property and surrounding properties.

3.3.4 City Directory

City Directories, published since the 18th century for major towns and cities, lists the name of the resident or business associated with each address. A city directory search conducted by EDR is located in Appendix F. The City Directory lists several neighboring properties, which would not be expected to impact the Property.

3.3.5 Government Agencies

The following agencies were contacted pertaining to possible past development and/or activity at the Property.

- USAF
- CAL-EPA Department of Toxic Substances Control
- Sacramento County Economic Development Department

3.4 ENVIRONMENTAL RECORD SOURCES

EDR performed a search of federal, tribal, state, and local databases regarding the Property and nearby properties. Details regarding the databases searched by EDR are provided in Appendix A. A list of the facilities documented by EDR within the approximate minimum search distance of the Property is provided below:

3.4.1 Federal ASTM Standard/Supplemental Sources

3.4.1.1 Subject Property

The Property is listed in the following Federal ASTM Standard or supplemental sources:

- <u>NPL</u>: Also known as Superfund, the National Priority List database is a subset of CERCLIS and identifies over 1,200 sites for priority cleanup under the Superfund program. The source of this database is the U.S. EPA.
- <u>CERCLIS</u>: The Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Information System contains data on potentially hazardous waste sites that have been reported to the USEPA by states, municipalities, private companies and private persons, pursuant to Section 103 of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA). CERCLIS contains sites, which are either proposed to or on the National Priorities List (NPL) and sites, which are in the screening and assessment phase for possible inclusion on the NPL.



- <u>CORRACTS</u>: CORRACTS is a list of handlers with RCRA Corrective Action Activity. This
 report shows which nationally-defined corrective action core events have occurred for every
 handler that has had corrective action activity.
- RCRA-TSDF: RCRAInfo is EPA's comprehensive information system, providing access to data supporting the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) of 1976 and the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984. The database includes selective information on sites, which generate, transport, store, treat and/or dispose of hazardous waste as defined by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). Transporters are individuals or entities that move hazardous waste from the generator offsite to a facility that can recycle, treat, store, or dispose of the waste. TSDFs treat, store, or dispose of the waste.
- RCRA-SQG: RCRAInfo is EPA's comprehensive information system, providing access to data supporting the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) of 1976 and the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984. The database includes selective information on sites, which generate, transport, store, treat and/or dispose of hazardous waste as defined by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). Small quantity generators (SQGs) generate between 100 kg and 1,000 kg of hazardous waste per month.
- <u>US ENG CONTROLS</u>: A listing of sites with engineering controls in place.
- <u>US INST CONTROL</u>: A listing of sites with institutional controls in place. Institutional
 controls include administrative measures, such as groundwater use restrictions, construction
 restrictions, property use restrictions, and post remediation care requirements intended to
 prevent exposure to contaminants remaining on site. Deed restrictions are generally required
 as part of the institutional controls.
- <u>DOD</u>: Consists of federally owned or administered lands, administered by the Department of Defense, that have any area equal to or greater than 640 acres of the United States, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands.
- <u>ROD</u>: Record of Decision. ROD documents mandate a permanent remedy at an NPL (Superfund) site containing technical and health information to aid the cleanup.

3.4.1.2 Other Properties

No surrounding properties within appropriate ASTM search distances of the Property were identified on Federal ASTM Supplemental sources

3.4.2 State ASTM Standard/Supplemental Sources

3.4.2.1 Subject Property

The Property is not listed on the State ASTM Standard or supplemental sources.



3.4.2.2 Other Properties

No surrounding properties within appropriate ASTM search distances of the Property were identified on State ASTM Supplemental sources

3.4.3 Local ASTM Supplemental Sources

3.4.3.1 Subject Property

The Property is not listed on Local ASTM supplemental databases.

3.4.3.2 Other Properties

No surrounding properties within appropriate ASTM search distances of the Property were identified on Local ASTM Supplemental sources.

The "Orphan Summary" lists Mather Air Force Base in the following databases:

- <u>CORTESE</u> "Cortese" Hazardous Waste & Substances Sites List The sites for the list are designated by the State Water Resource Control Board (LUST), the Integrated Waste Board (SWF/LS), and the Department of Toxic Substances Control (Cal-Sites). This listing is no longer updated by the state agency.
- <u>LUST Geotracker's Leaking Underground Fuel Tank Report</u> Leaking Underground Storage Tank Incident Reports. LUST records contain an inventory of reported leaking underground storage tank incidents. Not all states maintain these records, and the information stored varies by state.
- <u>SWEEPS UST SWEEPS UST Listing</u> Statewide Environmental Evaluation and Planning System. This underground storage tank listing was updated and maintained by a company contacted by the SWRCB in the early 1980's. The listing is no longer updated or maintained. The local agency is the contact for more information on a site on the SWEEPS list.
- <u>DEED Deed Restriction Listing</u> Site Mitigation and Brownfields Reuse Program Facility Sites with Deed Restrictions & Hazardous Waste Management Program Facility Sites with Deed / Land Use Restriction.
- ENVIROSTOR EnviroStor Database The Department of Toxic Substances Control's (DTSC's) Site Mitigation and Brownfields Reuse Program's database identifies sites that have known contamination or sites for which there may be reasons to investigate further.
- <u>CAL-SITES Calsites Database</u> The Calsites database contains potential or confirmed hazardous substance release properties. In 1996, California EPA reevaluated and significantly reduced the number of sites in the Calsites database



- <u>SLIC Statewide SLIC Cases</u> The Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanups (SLIC) listings includes unauthorized discharges from spills and leaks, other than from underground storage tanks or other regulated sites.
- <u>CHMIRS California Hazardous Material Incident Report System</u> California Hazardous Material Incident Reporting System. CHMIRS contains information on reported hazardous material incidents (accidental releases or spills).
- <u>HAZNET Facility and Manifest Data</u> Facility and Manifest Data. The data is extracted from the copies of hazardous waste manifests received each year by the DTSC.
- <u>CA FID UST Facility Inventory Database</u> The Facility Inventory Database (FID) contains a historical listing of active and inactive underground storage tank locations from the State Water Resource Control Board
- <u>FINDS Facility Index System/Facility Registry System</u> Facility Index System. FINDS contains both facility information and 'pointers' to other sources that contain more detail.
- <u>CA BOND EXP. PLAN Bond Expenditure Plan</u> Department of Health Services developed a site-specific expenditure plan as the basis for an appropriation of Hazardous Substance Cleanup Bond Act funds.
- <u>CA WDS Waste Discharge System</u> Sites which have been issued waste discharge requirements.
- <u>EMI Emissions Inventory Data</u> Toxics and criteria pollutant emissions data collected by the ARB and local air pollution agencies.
- <u>Sacramento County ML Regulatory Compliance Master List</u> Any business that has hazardous materials on site - hazardous material storage sites, underground storage tanks, waste generators.

Other sites in the "Orphan Summary" appear to be located beyond the ASTM recommended radius search criteria.

4.0 SITE RECONNAISSANCE

4.1 METHODOLOGY

ENGEO conducted a reconnaissance of the Property on July 27, 2012. The Property was viewed for hazardous materials storage, superficial staining or discoloration, debris, stressed vegetation, or other conditions that may be indicative of potential sources of soil or groundwater contamination. The site was also checked for evidence of fill/ventilation pipes, ground subsidence, or other evidence of existing or preexisting underground storage tanks. Photographs taken during the site reconnaissance are presented in Figure 3.



Given the physical size of the Property, it was not practicable to view every portion of the ground surface within the Property. Consequently, conditions may arise which this report does not address. However, we observed as much area of the Property as practical and accessible, given the circumstances.

4.2 GENERAL SITE SETTING

At the time of our site reconnaissance, the Property was unoccupied. The only active facility within the Property is a remote control airplane strip. An active golf course is situated on the adjoining land to the west. Mather Lake is located within the northern portion of the Property.

South of Mather Lake, the Property consists of vacant grasslands with some remnant building structures formerly used by the USAF. Pole mounted power lines cross through this portion of the Property in a west east direction

The central portion of the Property consists of the former weapons storage area and includes nine abandoned buildings, seven concrete/earthen weapons storage bunkers, and two wood/earthen bunker features. Asphalt roads extend throughout the weapons storage area and chain link fencing surrounds the perimeter of the weapons storage area.

South of the weapons storage area, an approximately 5-acre portion of the Property is currently leased by remote control airplane enthusiasts. The facility includes a small airstrip and two small shade structures.

The remaining portions of the Property consist of vacant grasslands. Evidence of past soil disturbance (roads, drainages, stockpiles) was visible throughout the open space area.

The Folsom south canal is a dominant feature extending along the east side of the Property. Three concrete bridges convey offsite runoff water across the canal and onto the Property.

4.3 EXTERIOR OBSERVATIONS

Structures. In the area east of the golf course, we observed two wood observation towers and a wood building and concrete slab. In the former weapons storage area to the south, we observed nine abandoned buildings. The buildings primarily consisted of concrete block construction and appeared to have been used by the USAF for storage, administration, and equipment maintenance. All of the buildings were gutted, with the exception of two large crane hoists that remained in two of the shop buildings. In the east portion of the weapons storage area we observed seven concrete weapons bunkers that were covered with soil and locked with large steel doors. We also noted two bermed areas with dilapidated overhead wood canopies. South of the weapons storage area, there are two newly constructed shade structures and an airstrip within the remote control airplane facility.



<u>Hazardous Substances and Petroleum Products in Connection with Identified Uses.</u> No hazardous substances or petroleum products were observed within the Property during the site reconnaissance.

<u>Storage Tanks</u>. No above-ground storage tanks or evidence of existing underground storage tanks was observed during the site reconnaissance.

<u>Odors</u>. No odors indicative of hazardous materials or petroleum material impacts were noted at the time of the reconnaissance.

<u>Pools of Potentially Hazardous Liquid</u>. No pools of potentially hazardous liquid were observed within the Property at the time of our reconnaissance.

<u>Drums</u>. No drums were observed on the Property at the time of the reconnaissance.

<u>Hazardous Substance and Petroleum Product Containers</u>. We observed an empty canister labeled .50 caliber at the collapsed building east of the golf course.

<u>Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs)</u>. We observed two pole-mounted transformers in the area east of the golf course. We noted no evidence of oil leaking from the transformers.

<u>Pits, Ponds and Lagoons</u>. Mather Lake is located in the north portion of the Property. We noted no evidence of debris in the lake. We noted an open "pit" like feature east of the collapsed building in the area east of the golf course. There was evidence of non-hazardous scrap metal and wood debris mixed with soil in the pit (Figure 3). A second larger pit known as OT-69 is located south of the weapons storage area. The USAF has performed numerous investigations and remedial excavations within the OT-69 pit area and we noted no evidence of hazardous materials.

<u>Stained Soil/Pavement</u>. No stained soil or pavement was observed within the Property at the time of our reconnaissance.

<u>Stressed Vegetation</u>. No signs of stressed vegetation were observed on the Property at the time of our reconnaissance.

<u>Solid Waste/Debris</u> Some buried scrap metal and wood debris is located at the previously mentioned pit area east of the golf course. The extent of this buried debris is unknown. We noted a substantial amount of large tree trunks stockpiled south of the weapons bunkers.

<u>Wastewater</u>. We observed drainage ditches extending along the perimeter of the weapons storage area, the former exercise area, and other non developed portions of the Property. No water was present in the ditches at the time of our site reconnaissance.



<u>Wells</u>. We observed a groundwater monitoring well in the southwest corner of the Property. The well was installed by Aerojet as part of a regional groundwater assessment.

<u>Septic Systems</u>. According to previous reports, a decommissioned 7,500 gallon septic tank and five dry wells are located within the central portion of the Property, between buildings 18080 and 18090.

4.4 INTERIOR OBSERVATIONS

We viewed the interior of several of the concrete buildings in the weapons storage area. We observed the interior of the buildings to be vacant, with the exception of two large crane hoists that remained in two of the shop buildings. We were unable to access the interior of the large weapons bunkers and several of the concrete buildings due to locked doors.

4.5 ASBESTOS-CONTAINING MATERIALS AND LEAD-BASED PAINT

An asbestos and lead-based paint survey was not conducted as part of this assessment. Given the age of the existing structures, it is conceivable that asbestos-containing materials and lead-based paint materials may exist within the structures. We did observed exposed fiberglass style insulation material in several of the buildings.

4.6 INDOOR AIR QUALITY

An evaluation of indoor air quality, mold, or radon was not included as part of the contracted scope of services. The California Department of Health Services has conducted studies of radon risks throughout the state, sorted by zip code. Results of the studies indicate that three tests were conducted within the Property zip code, with one tests exceeding the current EPA action level of 4 picocuries per liter [pCi/L]1).

According to the Final Superfund Record of Decision, Soil Operable Unit Sites and Groundwater Operable Plumes, Mather Air Force Base, Sacramento County, California, April 29, 1996, base wide radiation testing was performed and no elevated radiation levels were identified within the Property.

In accordance with ASTM E2600-10 (Tier 1) (Standard Guide for Vapor Encroachment Screening on Property Involved in Real Estate Transactions); we reviewed the Department of Toxic Substances Control EnviroStor database and noted one potential petroleum hydrocarbon source (active LUST case) for vapor intrusion mapped within 1/10 mile of the Property. Additionally, petroleum hydrocarbon impacts to soil and chlorinated solvent (VOC) impacts to soil vapor have been detected within the Property.

5.0 INTERVIEWS

We attended the BRAC Cleanup Team quarterly meeting on September 12, 2012 and discussed the project with various stakeholders including representatives from the USAF, CAL-EPA Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB-Region 5), Sacramento County Economic Development Department, US EPA, and URS. During the meeting, USAF representatives stated that no formal workplan would be required to conduct future phase II ESAs within the Property. USAF also stated that it would be responsible for remediation of potential contamination that is related to past USAF activities, if such contamination is found in the future. DTSC personnel stated that the previous NFA determinations that were issued by USAF for the AOCs (not including 597 and OT-69) are supportive of residential land use.

6.0 FINDINGS

The site reconnaissance and records review did identify evidence of soil and groundwater impairments associated with the use or past use of the Property. A review of regulatory databases maintained by county, state, tribal, and federal agencies found documentation of hazardous materials discharge on the Property and did identify contaminated facilities within the appropriate American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) search distances that would reasonably be expected to impact groundwater beneath the Property.

Based on the findings of this assessment, one Recognized Environmental Conditions (REC) and two historical RECs were identified for the Property. The identified RECs are discussed in detail in Section 8.0

7.0 OPINIONS AND DATA GAPS

The following data gaps identified during this process may affect the conclusions as to the presence or lack of presence of RECs at the Property.

- Pending Mather Lake access restrictions
- Pending OT-69 final report
- Extent of buried debris at former exercise area
- Limited chemical analysis of soil

8.0 CONCLUSIONS

The study included a review of local, state and federal environmental record sources, standard historical sources, aerial photographs, fire insurance maps and physical setting sources, a reconnaissance of the Property to review site use and current conditions to check for the storage, use, production or disposal of hazardous or potentially hazardous materials and interview with persons knowledgeable about current and past site use.



The site reconnaissance and records review did identify evidence of soil and groundwater impairments associated with the use or past use of the Property. A review of regulatory databases maintained by county, state, tribal, and federal agencies found documentation of hazardous materials discharge on the Property and did identify contaminated facilities within the appropriate American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) search distances that would reasonably be expected to impact groundwater beneath the Property.

Based on the findings of this assessment, one Recognized Environmental Conditions (REC) and two historical RECs were identified for the Property.

- REC: Previous soil remediation was performed under RWQCB oversight at the location of two leaking underground diesel storage tanks grouped east of building 18015. According to the no further action letter issued by the RWQCB-Region 5 in 2002, shallow vadose zone soil impacts remain adjacent to the building. A soil boring advanced at the UST site in 2001 identified a perched groundwater zone at 5 feet and the top of the regional groundwater table at 143 feet. A water sample collected from 10 feet exhibited motor oil at 1,300 ug/l. No constituents were detected in the sample from 143 feet. Former monitoring well MAFB-27C was located 1,000 feet south (downgradient) from the USTs, and exhibited no detections when abandoned in 1998, although historically the well exhibited low-level detections of methylene chloride, and oil/grease. Inactive offsite supply well K-9 located 1,000 feet west (cross gradient) of the UST exhibited trace concentrations of TCE from 1979-1981. Vapor samples collected from vapor monitoring wells exhibited concentrations of chlorinated compounds only, including TCE and PCE. A bioventing/vapor extraction remediation system was operated at the site and reportedly was successful in eliminating leaching concerns. The PCE and TCE impacts were not discussed in detail in the reports.
- <u>Historical REC</u>: USAF identified and evaluated six areas of concern (AOCs) within the Property: 1) 597 (Mather Lake), 2) weapons storage area (includes WP-17), 3) 41-acre suspected ordnance burial area, 4) 601 (includes XE404 and OT-69), 5) XU-400, 6) OT-86. One of the six AOCs that were evaluated by USAF currently has a restriction against residential land use and two additional AOCs may have potential development constraints. The current status of the three priority AOCs is summarized below:
 - O AOC 597. Mather Lake was historically used as a practice grenade firing range when the lake was dry in 1977. A geophysical survey to a depth of 1 foot was performed along the accessible portions of the lake and shoreline, which identified only limited amounts of expended small arms rounds. Restrictions against public access along the east and south shorelines are currently being developed by USAF.
 - OT-69/XE-404. OT-69 consists of an approximately 4-acre natural basin that lies approximately 10 feet below the surrounding grade. The basin was historically used by USAF as a detonation and burn area. XE-404 consists of an approximately 15-acre buffer area surrounding OT-69. Geophysical surveys were performed within the two areas to a depth of 10 feet; and subsequent excavations and mechanical screening of soil removed buried drums, classified aircraft parts, and small arms rounds at depths up to 12 feet. Soil



sampling was performed for dioxins and furans, metals, semivolatile organic compounds (SVOCs), perchlorate, and explosives (HMX, RDX, DNT, TNB, TNT). A CERCLA response action resulted in the excavation of the upper 1 foot of soil across the footprint of OT-69. The deed executed in 2000 requires written notification to be provided to USAF prior to any soil disturbance, including residential grading, within OT-69. Additionally, the 2010 Explanation of Significant Differences prohibits residential use, hospitals, public or private schools for minors, and day care centers within OT-69. To date, no formal restrictions have been established for the XE-404 area surrounding OT-69. Field investigations for OT-69 and XE-404 are reportedly complete and the final remedial completion report is pending.

- OT-86. The roughly 5-acre area was historically used as a small arms firing range. Surface soil sampling identified concentrations of total lead up to 1,660 milligrams per kilogram (mg/kg). Surface soil excavations conducted with OT086 resulted in the removal of approximately 3,200 cubic yards of soil. The established cleanup goal for lead within OT-69 was 130 mg/kg. The deed executed in 2000 requires written notification to be provided to USAF prior to any soil disturbance, including residential grading, within OT-86. The dig notifications listed in the 2000 deed for OT-86 may present an issue, if the deed remains on the chain of title for future residential parcels.
- Historical REC: A 7,500 gallon septic tank was backfilled with pea gravel in 2000 and five associated dry wells currently remain within the weapons storage area (WP-17), between buildings 18080 and 18090. USAF issued a letter in 1990 recommending no further action and the determination was finalized as part of the Record of Decision (ROD) in 1996. Former monitoring well MAFB-27C was located downgradient from the dry wells and exhibited no detections of when abandoned in 1998, although historically the well exhibited low-level detections of methylene chloride, and oil/grease. A soil boring was advanced to a depth of 155 feet immediately adjacent to the dry wells in 1995. Soil samples exhibited detections of methylene chloride and diesel to a depth of 67 feet. A groundwater sample was collected from 150 feet and no constituents were reportedly detected above the reporting limits by the mobile laboratory. The septic tank abandonment letter issued in 2000 states that there is no significant risk to groundwater. During a recent stakeholder meeting a representative for USAF reported that he is not aware of any historic industrial activities within the weapons storage area that would have generated hazardous waste..

Based on the review of regulatory databases and site reconnaissance, we present information on features of potential environmental concern that were either contained in the databases or observed on the Property. These features were not considered to be RECs. We briefly discuss each feature below:

• In addition to the above-mentioned UST case, five additional diesel USTs were removed from the weapons storage area. Following removal of these five USTs, no remedial actions were deemed necessary. Sacramento County Environmental Management Department issued no further action letters for the five USTs, and the "no further action" (NFA) letters do state that SCEMD must be notified in the event of a change in land use.



- During our phase I ESA site reconnaissance, we identified a seventh AOC consisting of scrap
 metal debris mixed with soil (former exercise area) located east of the golf course. USAF has
 indicated it does not intend to investigate or remediate this AOC. No geophysical surveys
 have been performed for the portions of the Property that are located outside of the six AOCs
 identified by USAF, which comprises a significant portion of the Property.
- The Property is located within an area where there are known regional groundwater impacts associated with offsite portions of the Mather Air Force Base and the Aerojet facility. The magnitude of regional groundwater contamination beneath the Property is relatively limited in extent and would not be considered a constraint for residential development.

ENGEO has performed a phase I environmental site assessment of the Property in general conformance with the scope and limitations of ASTM E 1527-05 "Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments" and USEPA "Standards and Practices for All Appropriate Inquires", 40 CFR Part 312. Based on the findings of this assessment, ENGEO recommends the following:

- 1. We conclude that at a minimum, excavation of shallow soil impacts associated with the former diesel USTs at Building 18015, may be necessary in support of residential land use, following demolition of the building. Additionally, further evaluation of potential vapor intrusion concerns may be necessary for this area subsequent to the additional soil remediation and prior to residential land use.
- 2. We recommend excavating test pits at the former exercise area (ENGEO AOC) to delineate the extent of the buried debris. USAF informed us that workplan approval is not required prior to us performing this work. In advance of future site development, we recommend coordinating with the USAF to develop a contingency plan for managing undocumented debris and/or contamination that may potentially be uncovered during grading operations.
- 3. We recommend performing Site wide surface soil sampling to evaluate concentrations of chemicals of concern in surface soil. USAF informed us that workplan approval is not required prior to us performing this work.

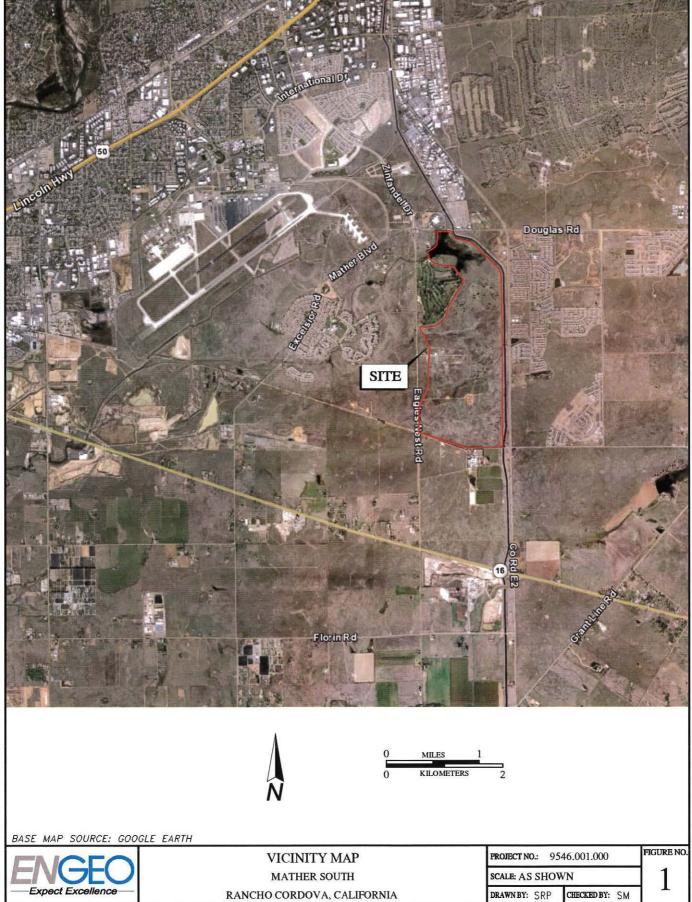
Figure 1 - Vicinity Map

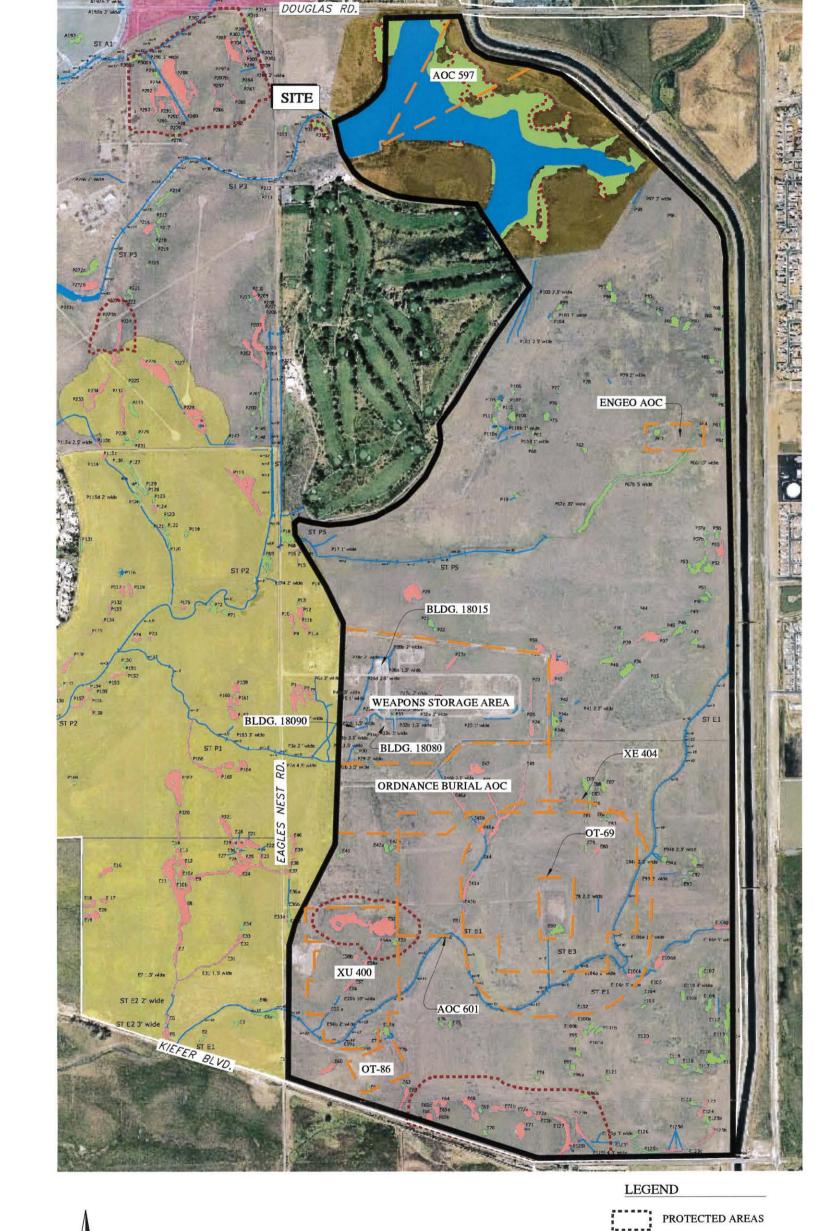

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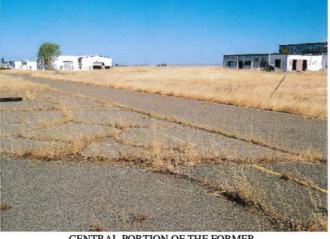

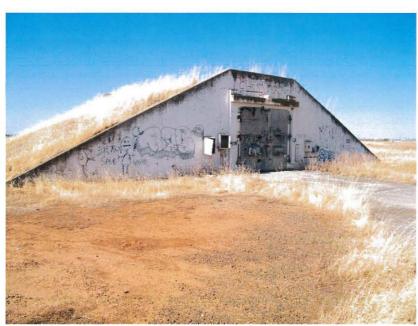

A CAP submitted to ACWD in 2009 involves using in-situ chemical oxidation (ISCO) to remediate groundwater and vadose zone soil impacts within the source area.
