**LEAD AGENCY AND ENTITY CARRYING OUT PROJECT:** Calaveras County Water District (Applicant)

**RESPONSIBLE AGENCY APPROVING PROJECT:** State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board)

**PROJECT LOCATION:** Within the Cities of West Point and Wilseyville, in the County of Calaveras.

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The Project consolidates a small sewer plant serving 28 residential connections in the nearby community of Wilseyville with the West Point plant while operating within existing capacity. The Project includes construction of a small lift station and 3-inch x 3,800 ft sewer pipeline, community septic tank to remove solids and equalize flows, septage/sludge facilities, installing synthetic liners in existing storage ponds, electrical/instrumentation upgrades, and a new 3-inch x 3500-ft pipeline to transfer effluent to the existing Wilseyville pond and spray field for auxiliary storage and disposal.

This is to advise that the State Water Board made the following California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) determinations and approved CWSRF financing on December 9, 2019 for the Project:

1. Determinations were made pursuant to the CEQA.
2. The State Water Board considered the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) as prepared by the Applicant for this Project.
3. A Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program was adopted by the Applicant for this Project.
4. Mitigation measures were made a condition of the Applicant's approval of the Project.
5. A Statement of Overriding Considerations was not adopted by the Applicant for this Project.
6. The Project will not have any adverse significant water quality effects.
