Project Title: Kuhlman Water Diversion, Impoundment and Stream Crossings Project (Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2017-0908-R1)

Project Location: The project to be completed is located within the Lower Eel River watershed, approximately 1.9 miles west southwest the town of Dinsmore, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Section 8, T01N, R05E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Larabee Valley U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Numbers 210-221-001, 210-221-002, 210-191-050; latitude 40.4834 N and longitude -123.6419 W at the point of diversion (POD).

Project Description: The project is limited to 6 encroachment(s) (Table 1). One encroachment is for water diversion from a spring tributary to the Van Duzen River. Water is diverted for domestic use and irrigation. Work for the water diversion will include use and maintenance of the water diversion infrastructure. The 5 other proposed encroachments are to upgrade failing and undersized stream crossings. Work for these encroachments will include excavation, removal of the failing crossings, replacement with new properly sized crossings, backfilling and compaction of fill, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion.

The initial notification materials disclosed a proposed reservoir located in an area that the available evidence indicated may be potential wetlands. A wetland delineation was requested by CDFW to determine if proposed project actions would impact aquatic resources. A wetland delineation was eventually provided to CDFW on June 3, 2020, and based on the results, Permittee's consultant has indicated that the proposed reservoir is no longer under consideration at this time. The wetland delineation revealed that three-parameter wetlands exist on the parcel near cannabis cultivation areas. A coordinated site inspection with CDFW and State or Regional Water Board staff is necessary to determine if cannabis cultivation and development activities have adversely impacted aquatic resources and whether additional mitigation is necessary.

No other projects that may be subject to FGC section 1602 were disclosed. This Agreement does not retroactively permit any constructed reservoirs (including "ponds"), stream crossings, water diversions, modifications to riparian buffers, or other encroachments not described in Table 1. **Determination:** This is to advise that CDFW, acting as \square the Lead Agency $/ \boxtimes$ a Responsible Agency approved the above described project and has made the following determinations regarding the project pursuant to California Code of Regulations section 15096, subdivision (i): 1.
