**Project Title:** Hoang Water Diversion, Onstream Reservoir Removal and Stream Crossings Project (Streambed Alteration Agreement No. EPIMS-HUM-13648-R1C)

**Project Location:** The project is located within the Supply Creek watershed, approximately 5.9 miles northwest of the town of Willow Creek, County of Humboldt, State of California; Section 21, T7N, R4E, Humboldt Base and Meridian, in the Willow Creek U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 522-024-002 & 522-025-003; latitude 40.9746 N and longitude 123.7383 W at the point of diversion (POD).

**Project Description:** This Agreement relies on the Notification materials and a desk review without a CDFW site inspection. The project is limited to six encroachment(s) (Table 1). One encroachment is for water diversion from an unnamed tributary to Supply Creek. Water is diverted for domestic use only. Work for the water diversion will include use and maintenance of the water diversion infrastructure. One encroachment is to authorize work that the Permittee has elected to pursue to remove an unpermitted onstream reservoir. Work for the reservoir removal will involve dewatering, use of a coffer dam, removal of a culvert and decommissioning of a stream crossing. The Permittee will proceed as notified in coordination with CDFW for project timing. Four encroachments are to upgrade stream crossings. Work for these encroachments will include excavation, removal of the failing crossings, replacement with new properly sized crossings, backfilling and compaction of fill, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion.

The Notification also discloses the use of a well located at Lat/Long 40.9746, -123.7237. This well is presented as the sole source of water for all cannabis cultivation on the properties. CDFW did not evaluate hydraulic



connection of the well to surface water, nor was a hydrogeologic evaluation prepared by a licensed geologist provided for CDFW review. Based on the available resources, the well may be hydraulically connected to streams and/or springs and shall be evaluated for potential impacts from commercial cannabis irrigation use through the County's conditional use permit/cannabis cultivation permit (PLN-11978 & PLN-11980).
