#### Re: Request for Information Regarding Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services and Facilities for the 6220 West Yucca Street Mixed-Use Project in the City of Los Angeles

Dear Captains Milick and Woolf:

In coordination with the City of Los Angeles Department of City Planning, PCR Services Corporation is preparing an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the proposed 6220 West Yucca Street Mixed-Use project (project) in the Hollywood area pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

The EIR will include an assessment of the project's potential impacts on fire protection and emergency medical services and facilities. Since the project is located within the jurisdiction of the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD), we are requesting information from your agency with regards to fire protection and emergency medical services and facilities. In order to maintain the schedule for the EIR, we respectfully request your input by **September 28, 2015**.

The following is a brief description of the project and a list of information requested to support the evaluation of fire protection and emergency medical services and facilities in the EIR. The regional location map, aerial photograph with surrounding uses, and the project site plans are attached to this letter.

#### **Project Description**

<u>Project Location and Surrounding Area</u>. The project site is located on the south side of West Yucca Street between Argyle Avenue and North Vista Del Mar Avenue (addresses: 1756, 1760 North Argyle Avenue; 6210-6220 West Yucca Street; and 1765, 1771, 1771, and 1779 North Vista Del Mar Avenue) in the Hollywood community of the City of Los Angeles, approximately five miles

northwest of Downtown Los Angeles as shown on **Figure A-1**, *Regional and Project Vicinity Locations*. The project site is bounded by Yucca Street, a vacant 5-story commercial building, and 3-story residential lofts to the north; North Vista Del Mar Avenue and 1- and 2-story single-family residences and duplexes to the east; vacant land (former Little Country Church of Hollywood) and 1- and 2-story single-family residences and duplexes followed by a 5-story mixed-use residential and commercial development to the south; and Argyle Avenue and commercial uses to the west. **Figure A-2**, *Aerial Photograph with Surrounding Land Uses*, illustrates the surrounding uses.

<u>Proposed Project</u>. The project would consist of two buildings, Buildings 1 and 2. Building 1 (up to 32-stories) would occupy the majority of the project site atop a six-level podium structure with one semi-subterranean level (P1 Level), and would include a mix of residential, hotel, and commercial/restaurant uses. Building 2 would be 6-stories with only residential uses. Overall, the project would include 191 multi-family residential units (including 39 affordable units), 260 hotel rooms, approximately 6,980 square feet of commercial/restaurant uses (P1 and Ground Levels), and a total of 372,450 square feet of floor area. Parking for all proposed uses would be provided within a six-level (one semi-subterranean level) parking structure housed within the podium structure of Building 1. The proposed development is summarized below in **Table A-1**, *Proposed Project Summary*. The site plans are illustrated in **Figure A-3**, *Site Plan*, **Figure A-4**, *P1 Level Plan*, **Figure A-5**, *Ground Level Plan*, and **Figure A-6**, *Building Section 1*.

<u>Access</u>. Vehicular access to the project site would be provided via Yucca Street and Argyle Avenue. Vehicular access to commercial/restaurant and hotel shared parking within the P1 Level would be provided via an ingress/egress ramp into the parking facility from Argyle Avenue (see Figure A-4). Hotel self-parking is available from the Argyle Avenue parking entry. Commercial/restaurant and hotel truck deliveries would also utilize the same ingress/egress ramp on the P1 Level. Project residents would access parking on Level 2 through Level 5 via a gate-controlled ingress/egress ramp located on the Ground Level along Yucca Street (see Figure A-5). Hotel and guest access would also be via the port-o-cochere located within the Ground Level on Yucca Street (see Figure A-5).

Pedestrian access to commercial/restaurant uses would be provided from various at-grade sidewalks and steps equipped with café tables, parkway planters, and bike parking along Argyle Avenue, Yucca Street, and Vista Del Mar Avenue. Access to commercial/restaurant uses on Argyle Avenue and Yucca Street would be unrestricted during business hours, with public access discontinued after businesses have closed. Pedestrian access to residential uses would be restricted through the use of an electronically access controlled residential only lobby within Building 2 on the Ground Level. Additionally, residents would be provided access via a shared residential/hotel lobby within Building 1 on the Ground Level. Hotel access would be restricted through the use of a staffed hotel lobby (also shared with residential uses) on the Ground Level and through the use of hotel key cards.

  - iii. Equipment and staffing (e.g., engines, trucks, squads, total full-time and parttime staff, number of firefighters on 24-hour duty, paramedic staff and services, etc.);
- A general overview of the LAFD's emergency response system (i.e., emergency response plans, standard operation protocols and procedures, etc.);
- Most recent data on yearly emergency incidents for each station serving the project area (broken up by type) and associated average response times;
- Planned improvements to the fire protection facilities in the service area of the project site (i.e., expansion, new facilities, additional staffing, etc.), if applicable;
- Development requirements as relevant to the project including:
  - Fire flow requirements for a building of this design, height, and location;

Regarding required fire hydrant flow, there are conflicting sections of the fire code that both determine the flow rate. Under Section 507.3.1 Fire-flow requirements refer to type of land development and for 507.3.3 they refer to land use with a footnote to the general plan. The table for 507.3.3 has the title of response distances. The project applicant has been told that the fire captain or inspector typically goes to Zimas and if it is a commercial zone, they apply the 6,000 gpm to 9,000 gpm requirement. We won't know until the SAR comes back what is available, however, there are certain parts of the City where 9,000 gpm is not available. Can you confirm? Thanks!

# 1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

#### 1.1 **Program Summary**

- This briefing is a summary of the overall activities for the 2000 Proposition F, Fire Facilities Bond Program. Included is an overview of progress through March 15, 2015.
- The Fire Facilities Bond consists of an Air Operations Facility, 18 fire stations and 1 Regional fire station/Training facility:

Air Operations Facility	Facility includes GSD Maintenance Building, LAFD Ops Hanger, and LAFD Crash FS
1 Satellite Fire Station	New fire station located in the San Pedro area.
8 Standard Fire Stations	Replace existing fire stations.
9 Regional Fire Stations	Replace 6 fire stations and expand 3 existing.
1 Regional/Training Fire Station Facility	Construct one new Facility (Arleta FS 81)

- On February 2001, MOU's were signed between Department of Public Works, Bureau of Engineering, Contract Administration, Department of General Services and Fire Department for work on the 2000 Proposition F Bond.
- On February 13, 2001, Council adopted the "Governance Structure for the Animal Services and Fire Facilities Construction Program."

- Citizen's Oversight Committee formed in April 2002.
- On September 22, 2002, the Board of Public Works approved the Pre-qualification of Contractors for Proposition F, Fire Facilities Program construction.

#### 1.2 Master Program Schedule

- □ The Master Schedule provides for all fire stations to be completed within approximately 8.5 years from November 8, 2000, (the date the Voters approved Proposition F, Fire Facilities/Animal Shelter Facilities Bond).
- 18 sites acquired and 2 sites are will be leased from LAWA.
- Construction is in progress on 1 facilities, Hollywood FS 82.
- □ Construction completed on 19 facilities out of the 20 required by the program.

#### 1.3 Budget/Contract Commitments

On July 31, 2001 the City Council adopted a resolution providing for the issuance and sale of the City of Los Angeles General Obligation Bonds, Series 2001-A, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$201.3 million. \$113.1 million for the Proposition F, Fire/Paramedic/Helicopter Facilities Bond Program, \$36.7 million is for Animal Shelter Facilities, \$36.5 for 1998 Library Bond, \$15 million for the 1998 Zoo Improvement Program.



- The \$113.1 million proceeds from the July 31,2001 bond sale establishes the maximum funds available for land acquisition, design, construction, and management through December 2002.
- On June 12, 2002, Council adopted the Proposition F, budget, master program schedule and staffing plan.
- Second Bonds, Series 2002-A, for \$49.2 million for Proposition F, Fire/Paramedic/Helicopter Facilities Bond Program, \$31.0 million is for Animal Shelter Facilities, \$26.1 million for Zoo Improvement Program and \$155.6 for Proposition Q.
- Third Bond Series 2003-A for \$97 million Proposition F, Fire/Paramedic/Helicopter Facilities Bond Program, \$75.4 million is for Animal Shelter Facilities, \$70 million for Proposition Q.
- March 2004, Administrative Oversight Committee adopted the deletion of the LAPD Fixed Wing Hanger from the Proposition F Program. The budget for the project \$3.327 million will be reallocated to Program Contingency. Project will be constructed with Prop Q funds.
- March 2004, Administrative Oversight Committee adopted the reallocation of \$1.736 million from the Program Contingency to construction cost for the San Pedro, FS 36.
- May 2004, Administrative Oversight Committee adopted the reallocation of \$2,500,000 from program contingency to Civic Center, FS 4. The reallocation was; \$300,000 to design and \$2,200,000 to construction.

- May 2004, Administrative Oversight approved the reallocation of construction funds for the Air Operations Facility to match the construction bids.
- September 2004, Administrative Oversight adopted the reallocation of \$1,057,000 million from the Program Contingency to construction cost for San Pedro FS 36.
- January 2005, Administrative Oversight adopted the reallocation of \$1,624,000 million from the Program Contingency to construction cost for San Pedro FS 62.
- □ In February 2005 the AOC adopted a revised Master Schedule.
- In February 2005 the AOC adopted a reallocations of a 10% increase to the construction budget for FS 94, 82, 87, 43, 13, 21, 78 & 64.
- In May 2005 the AOC adopted construction budget increase/reallocation for FS 87 of \$597,000.
- □ In July 2005 the AOC adopted construction budget increase/reallocation of \$2.146 million from Program Contingency to construction budget for FS 43.
- In July 2005 the AOC adopted a Master Schedule change to FS 64 of an additional six months.
- In October 2005 the AOC adopted construction budget increase/reallocation of \$3,570,855 from Program Contingency to FS 4 construction and design.
- □ November AOC meeting concurred with the recommendation to award the South Los

Angeles Fire Station 21 without a budget adjustment.

- □ February 2006 the AOC approved the budget reallocation of \$2,010,700 from the Program Contingency to Studio City FS 78 construction budget.
- March 2006 the AOC approved the budget rellocation of \$2,700,000 from the Program Contingency to Pico Union, FS 13 construction budget.
- June 2006 the AOC approved the budget reallocation of \$2,610,000 from the Program Contingency to the South Los Angeles, FS 64 construction budget.
- □ July 2006 the AOC approved the new Master Schedule for the Program.
- In January 2007 the AOC approved the increase in the budget to the Project/Construction Management. The budget adjustments were from the Bond Issuance (\$2,885,000) and various Project Saving (\$2,180,000).

- □ In August 2007, AOC approved the reappropriation of \$4,939,950 from the Program contingency to the construction budget for FS 94.

- In August 2007, AOC approved the contract ceiling increase by \$4,560,000 to the PM/CM Bovis Lend Lease contract.

- In August, the AOC approved the contract extension to the PM/CM Bovis Lend Lease Contract by 4 years to October 2012.
- □ In November 2007, the AOC approved the reallocation of \$14,136,584 from interest earnings to the Hollywood FS 82; \$1,890,416 from Bond Issuance to the Hollywood FS 82; and \$6,549,000 to Program Support.
- September 2008, AOC approved a project schedule adjustment to the Crenshaw fire station 94. Construction end date is May 2010, due to unforeseen conditions at the site.
- □ In November 2008, AOC approved the following:
  - \$27.6 million for future replacement fire station 7
  - Reallocation of land acquisition cost saving of \$10,671,861 to the Program Contingency.
- On April 14, 2009, Council adopted the addition of a new fire station to the program, Arleta FS 7.
- On June 25, 2009 the AOC adopted a revised program budget of cost savings from the various projects to Program Contingency and increased the Project budgets for FS 4 and 21.
- On July 9, 2009, the AOC approved the an additional drop down Fire Station 39 for the amount of \$37.1 million.

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# 3.0 BUDGET

#### 3.1 Approved Program Budget

- □ The Program Budget for the 2000 Proposition F, Fire Facilities Program totals \$378,506,000 and was approved by the Oversight Committee on July 16, 2001. The use of funds are detailed in the diagram below. Each fire station project has funds allocated for land acquisition, design, construction, and other direct costs.
- On August 2002, the Oversight Committee adopted a new budget. The Program Budget for the 2000 Proposition F. Fire Facilities Program remains unchanged. The funds were reallocated from the LAPD Motor Transport Division Project to land acquisition for Civic Center Fire Station 4.
- □ On March 2004, the Oversight Committee adopted a new budget. The LAPD Fixed Wing Facility was deleted and will be funded by Prop Q. LAPD Fixed Wing Facility budget of \$3.327 will be reallocated to the Program contingency.
- □ On March 2004, the Oversight Committee adopted a the recommendation to reallocate \$1.736 from the Program Contingency to the San Pedro, fire station 36 construction cost and reallocate \$500K from the "Other Direct;" \$100K to design and \$400K to the construction of the project.
- On May 2004, the Oversight Committee adopted the reallocation of \$2,500,000 from the Program Contingency to the Civic Center, FS 4 and \$1.5 million was reallocated from the Prop Q funds. The reallocation was as follows; \$300,000 to design, new design budget \$1,032,000 and 2,200,000 to construction, new construction budget \$8,161,000.
- On May 2004, the Oversight Committee adopted the reallocation of funds for the Air Operations Facility to match the bids received for the project. The reallocation is as follows; Site Development and Demolition adjusted from \$5,048,000 to \$10,800,000; LAFD Crash Rescue/FS no change; LAFD Hanger/FS adjusted from \$11,290,000 to \$9,483,000; and GSD Maintenance Hanger adjusted from \$15,796,000 to \$11,851,000. No net change to the program construction budget.
- □ On September 2004, the Oversight Committee adopted a the recommendation to reallocate and additional \$1,057,000 from the Program Contingency to the San Pedro, fire station 36 construction cost to award the construction project. New construction budget \$6,049,000.
- □ On February 4, 2005, the Oversight Committee adopted reallocation of \$1,624,000 from the Program Contingency to the Mar Vista, fire station 62 construction cost, new construction budget \$8,118,000.
- February 24, 2005, the Oversight Committee adopted the reallocation of 10% increase to the following fire stations 13, 21, 43, 64, 87, 82, 87 and 94
- □ May 26, 2005, the Oversight Committee adopted the reallocation of \$597,000 from the program contingency to construction budget for the Northridge FS 87.
- July 2005, the Oversight Committee adopted the reallocation of \$2,214,550 from the program contingency

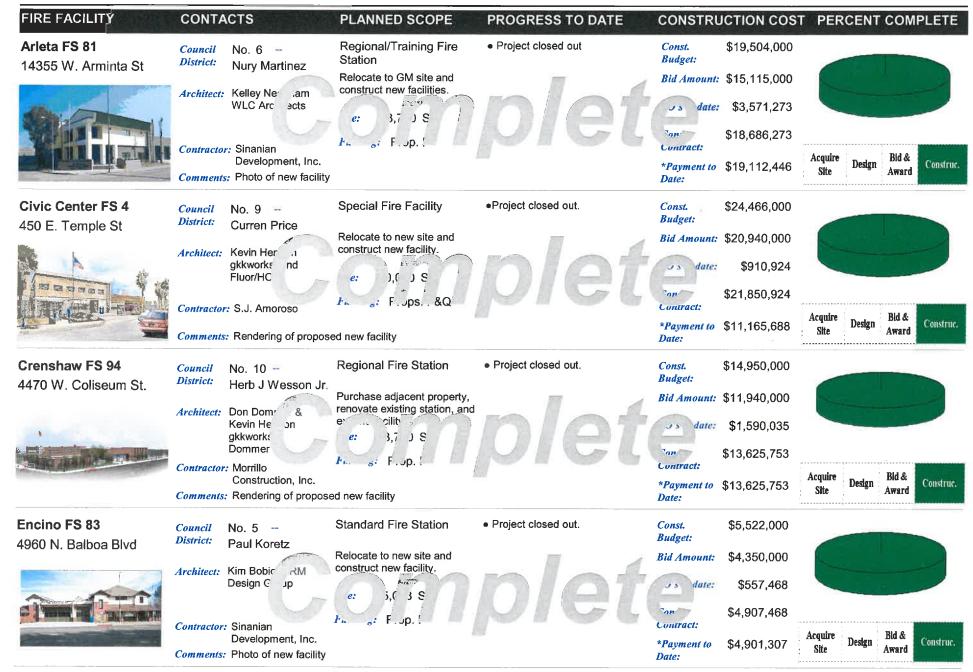

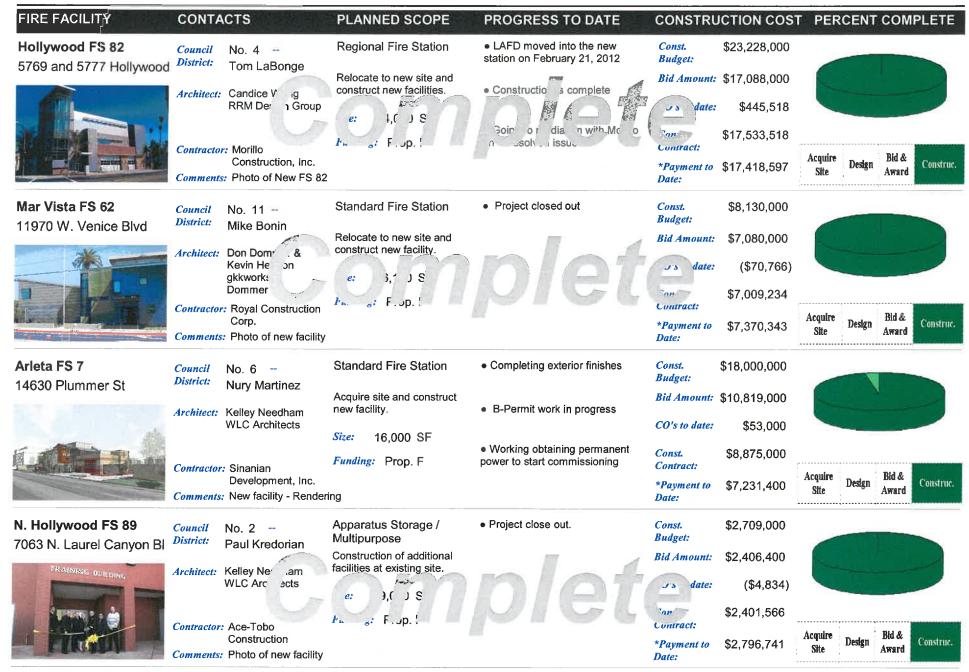
