The project consists of the construction of a CarMax pre owned automobile dealership, service building, and non public carwash with associated access drives, parking lots and landscaped areas within approximately 7.13 acres. The total project site is 15.09 acres, with the remaining area to be used for open space and water treatment. The project includes a General Plan Amendment, Rezone, Tentative Parcel Map, Land Use Code (LUC) Amendment, and Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to allow the development.
