Project Location (include county): The project is located at unnamed drainages tributary to Wasteway No. 2 tributary to the Whitewater River (Coachella Valley Stormwater Channel), along Interstate Highway 10 (I-10) about 3.4 miles east of the Dillon Road exit, within the City of Coachella in the County of Riverside, State of California; Latitude 33.7005° N, Longitude 116.1148° W. Sections 25, 26, 35, and 36, Township 5 South, Range 8 East, United States Geological Survey (USGS) map Thermal Canyon, San Bernardino Meridian.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2018-0162-R6, pursuant to section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, the City of Coachella.

The project is limited to the construction of a new spread diamond-type interchange to connect to the planned future extension of Avenue 50 in the City of Coachella. The new interchange includes a westbound loop and direct on-ramps, eastbound direct on-ramp, and direct off-ramps for both westbound and eastbound lanes. The proposed design will include a left-turn lane onto the future southbound Avenue 50. The bridge length will be 125 feet.
