#### **Hazardous Waste Special Provision**

- A lead compliance plan is required. The estimated cost to include the LCP is \$3,000.
- Standard Special Provision (SSP) 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii) Earth Material Containing Lead and 14-11.14 for treated wood waste shall be added to the construction contract.

#### **Water Quality**

• If the project disturbs less than one acre of soil, a Water Pollution Control Plan (WPCP) is required to be prepared by the contractor following the Caltrans 2018 Standard Specification Section 13-1 – Water Pollution.

### **Noise**

 Short term construction noise impacts need to be addressed in accordance with Caltrans Standard Specs section 14-8.

# <u>Air</u>

A Dust Control Plan (DCP) is needed if at least 2,500 cubic yards of material are moved in a day for at least three days of the project or 5 or more acres of land will be disturbed during construction. A non-standard special provision will need to be included in the project specifications if a Dust Control Plan is needed.

### **Paleontology**

• If unanticipated fossil discovery occurs during construction, Specification 14-7.03 of the 2018 Standard Specifications identifies the procedures required to protect the resource.

## **Biology**

If construction occurs within the nesting season, February 1 to September 30 then:

- 1) Pre-construction survey 15 days prior to the start of construction.
- 2) Worker Environmental Awareness Training.
