The proposed, "5420 Sunset Project," located at 5420 Sunset Boulevard Los Angeles, CA 90027, is located in Reporting District 0659. This "RD" falls within the geographical boundaries of the Los Angeles Police Department's Hollywood Division. A project of this size could have a minor impact on police services within Hollywood Division's, Community area. The Department is available to advise you on crime prevention features appropriate for the design of the property in this project. The following report was prepared for the “5420 Sunset Project”:

Distance and Times:

The 5420 Sunset Project located at 5420 Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles, CA., 90028 is approximately 1.6 miles at 7 minutes from the Hollywood Community Police Station. This time and distance was calculated from a departure point starting from The Hollywood Community Police Station. The arrival time was also configured utilizing some traffic delays, but estimated times of arrival can vary depending on divisional call load, traffic delays and types of calls.

The Reporting District for Hollywood Community Police Station is RD 0666. Their Phone number is (213) 972-2971.

Divisional Geographics / Demographics:

Hollywood Community Police Station’s Geographical Patrol Area is approximately 13.34 square miles and consists of 35 Reporting Districts. The service boundaries for Hollywood Area are as follows:

To the **West** is North La Brea Avenue, Romaine Street, Los Angeles County West Hollywood Boundary, Fountain Avenue, North Fairfax Avenue, Los Angeles County West Hollywood Boundary, Ozeta Terrace, North Clark Street, Ozeta Terrace, Los Angeles County West Hollywood Boundary (land only, no streets), City of Beverly Hills Boundary (land only, no street delineation), Briarcrest Road and Los Angeles Police Department’s West Los Angeles Boundary.

To the **North** is Mulholland Drive, Hollywood US 101 Freeway, Barham Boulevard and Los Angeles Police Department’s North Hollywood Boundary.

To the **East** is Los Angeles Police Department’s North East Boundary (land only deviation), Fern Dell Drive, Los Feliz Boulevard, Western Avenue, Franklin Avenue and Normandie Avenue.

To the **South** is Melrose Avenue, Soward Street and Willoughby Avenue.

The proposed 5420 Sunset Project is located in RD 0659. The boundaries for RD 0659 are as follows:

To the **West** is Western Avenue.

To the **North** is West Sunset Boulevard.

To the **East** is Normandie Avenue.

To the **South** is Fountain Avenue.

Hollywood Division has approximately 381 sworn personnel and 16 civilian support staff. Hollywood Division is a culturally diverse community with a dense residential population of over 165,000 people. The officer to resident ratio is 1 officer to every 433 residents (433:1) for a 13.34 square mile area. This population amount does not reflect citizens from outside the area visiting local businesses, churches, residences and educational institutions.

Divisional Support and Communication:

There are many specialized support units, divisions and services available to Hollywood Division within the LAPD. These services are available to supplement the division's policing. In using the available resources, the Los Angeles Police Department can meet the demands for police services for the 5420 Sunset Project.

Hollywood Community Police Station's emergency response system is directly linked to the Los Angeles Police Departments' Communication Dispatch Center. Communication Division has the responsibility to staff and answer telephone calls for service on a 24- hour basis. This includes 911 emergency calls (police, fire and medical). Communication Division's main protocol is to manage and dispatch police calls for service in the City of Los Angeles.

Divisional Response Times:

According to the Los Angeles Police Department's Computer Statistics (CompStats) Division, the average police response time to emergency, high priority calls in the Hollywood Area (Code 3 calls) was 3.3 minutes (as of May 23rd 2020). This was done with a dispatch median time of 1.4 minutes. The medium high priority response time (Code 2) as of May 23rd 2020, was 10.7 minutes. This was done with a dispatch median time of 3.6 minutes. Low priority, non-emergency response times as of May 23rd 2020, was 32.3 minutes. These low priority calls had a dispatch median time of 8.7 minutes.

Citywide response times during this same 4 week period were 4.1 minutes for emergency, high priority calls with a dispatch median time of 1.5 minutes. The medium, high priority response time was 12.6 minutes with a dispatch time of 4.1 minutes. Low priority response times were 31.2 minutes with a dispatch time of 11.9 minutes.

These response times were taken from the statistics submitted by Hollywood Division and CompStats for a 4 week period between April 26th 2020 through May 23rd 2020.

During this 4 week period, Hollywood Division answered 319 emergency calls for service, 1,370 medium high priority calls and 2,232 low priority calls. Citywide, the Los Angeles Police Department answered 7,582 emergency calls for service, 28,475 medium high priority calls and 38,361 low priority calls. The response times stated are adequate performance times for this police division.


There are no Planned improvements to the police protection facility in the service area of the project site at this time.
