Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The WRTP Specific Plan is the overarching policy and planning document for the City's designated new growth area for future specific plan development, SP-1A, as identified in the 2035 General Plan. The WRTP Specific Plan is comprehensive in scope, addressing land use, transportation, community design, housing, conservation of resources, economic development, public facilities and infrastructure, public safety, and open space, among many other subjects. The WRTP Specific Plan would provide for a variety of housing types and non-residential land uses, as well as parks and open space and supportive public facilities and infrastructure. A multi-modal street network and bike-pedestrian trail system in the WRTP Specific Plan have been designed to balance the circulation and flow of vehicular traffic with the provision of safe and accessible facilities for walking, biking, public transit, and ride share drop-off/pick-up. A modified grid street network provides circulation and access within the WRTP Specific Plan Area, to the Spring Lake Specific Plan Area, and adjacent areas of the city. While not a part of the WRTP Specific Plan Area, the Draft EIR also addresses potential impacts associated with off-site improvement areas.

The Draft EIR has identified the below-listed environmental issue areas as having potentially significant environmental impacts from implementation of the WRTP Specific Plan.
