Thank you for including the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) in the environmental review process for the Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for the Mitsubishi Cement Corporation at Warehouse C: Bulk Cement Warehouse and Loading Facility Project located near Interstate 5 (I-5) and (State Route 75 (SR-75) at the Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal in the Barrio Logan area. The mission of Caltrans is to provide a safe, sustainable, integrated and efficient transportation system to enhance California's economy and livability. The Local Development-Intergovernmental Review (LD-IGR) Program reviews land use projects and plans to ensure consistency with our mission and state planning priorities.

Caltrans has the following comments:

- 1. Please provide additional details for Table 4-1 proposed project trip generation, including the peak hour rates/splits and employee rates.
- 2. The provided Synchro files' delay results do not match the delay results shown in the traffic impact study, please clarify.
- 3. Please clarify the proposed transportation mitigation for the Tenth Avenue Marine Terminal is separate from the Mitsubishi Warehouse C project transportation mitigation.
- 4. Provide additional details for mitigation measure MM-TRA-4R and analysis that this mitigation will improve the intersection. Per Caltrans 2002 "Guide for the

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- Preparation of Traffic Impact Studies" this mitigation measure needs to be fully implemented by the Mitsubishi Warehouse C project instead of a fair share contribution of 1.4% of the total cost.
- 5. Caltrans sent a comment letter for the Notice of Preparation on October 16, 2017 regarding the state highway systems to include in the traffic impact study. Please provide a response or justification as to why the traffic study did not implement or analyze the locations identified in our comment letter.
