If the Initiative is approved, the proposed amendments would guide future development at the project site. The Initiative identifies the potential for a resort on the project site with a range between 118 and 182 units and a total of 410,970 sf of development within 11.80 acres of the 17.45-acre project site. Remaining areas would be devoted to passive recreation and open space or would be protected due to steep slopes and coastal bluffs.
