Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The City of Sanger is updating it's 2003 General Plan and is including the North Academy Corridor Master Plan area along with the 2035 General Plan Update and EIR. The following General Plan Elements are being updated: Land Use, Circulation, Open Space & Conservation, Safety, Noise, and Environmental Justice. The Housing Element was updated separately from this current process. The Master Plan area comprises approximately 285 acres and proposes a variety of land uses (mixed use, commercial and residential).

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

Implementation of the General Plan and Master Plan could potentially result in significant impacts to agricultural farmland, air quality / greenhouse gases, biological resources, cultural resources, hydrology, noise, transportation and public utilities. The General Plan Update includes policies to reduce impacts to these areas. In addition, specific mitigation is included for biology (protection measures), cultural resources (protection measures), hydrology (water use reduction), and transportation (requirement for fair share fees, traffic studies, etc.). However, significant impacts could still occur after implementation of the General Plan Update policies and EIR mitigation measures in the following impact areas: loss of agricultural resources, air quality / GHG, hydrology, and transportation.
