The proposed 2159 Bay Street Project will be under the jurisdiction of Newton Community Police Station, located at 3400 South Central Avenue, Los Angeles, CA 90011. Telephone Number (323) 846-6547.

The project site is approximately 2.8 miles and 11 minutes without traffic from the Police Station in Reporting District (RD) 1309.

Newton Geographic Area is approximately 9 square miles and consists of 45 Reporting Districts. The service boundaries for Newton Area are as follows: Washington Boulevard, 7<sup>th</sup> Street to the North, Vernon Avenue, Florence Avenue to the South, the Los Angeles River, the Los Angeles City Boundary to the East, and the Harbor Freeway to the West.

It has approximately 323 sworn personnel and 32 civilian support staff assigned. It is a culturally diverse community with a population of approximately 150,000 people. The officer to resident ratio is; 1 officer to 464 residents in Newton Area. Additionally, there are special service teams available within the LAPD to service Newton Area.

Newton Station's emergency response system is directly linked to the Los Angeles Police Department Communications Division's Dispatch Centers. Communications Division has the responsibility to staff and answer, on a 24-hour basis, the telephones upon which calls for service are received. This includes 911 emergency calls (police, fire, and paramedic). Communication Division handles only police related calls for the City.

The average response time to emergency calls for service in Newton Area during 2018 was 4.1 minutes. The average response time for non-emergency calls for service in Newton Area during 2018 was 29.9 minutes.
