Project Decription (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The Globemaster Corridor Specific Plan (GCSP) would guide land uses for the approximately 437-acre Plan Area and allow development within this Plan Area as defined in the GCSP. The GCSP creates a policy framework for the development and improvement of the Plan Area into an employment district in an area adjacent to the Long Beach Airport, Port of Long Beach, Interstate (I-) 405 freeway, and surrounding residential and business community. The GCSP assigns appropriate land use districts for land properties within the Plan Area, including six development districts and two overlay zones: Business Park, Community Commercial, Industrial Commercial, General Industrial, Airport, Open Space, Cherry Avenue Overlay Zone, and Airport Environs Overlay Zone. The GCSP establishes a land use and mobility plan, land use and development regulations, urban design guidelines, infrastructure systems, and implementation and administration necessary to becoming a flexible commercial and industrial district in the City. No residential component is included in the GCSP.

The Draft EIR/EIS has determined that the Proposed Project would result in significant and unavoidable environmental impacts to air quality, cultural resources, greenhouse gas emissions, and transportation. The Proposed Project would also have the potential for significant environmental impacts in the area of aesthetics, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, noise, tribal cultural resources, and utilities and service systems; mitigation measures have been included to reduce these impacts to a less than significant level.
