Project Title:

Woodville Landfill Expansion (SCH #2018121007).

Project Location:

The proposed Project site is in western Tulare County, located approximately 12 miles southeast of the City of Visalia, seven miles southeast of the City of Tulare, and 13 miles northwest of the City of Porterville, at the intersection of Avenue 200 and Road 152. The landfill address is 19800 Road 152, Tulare, CA 93274 (APN 196-040-029). The site lies within the Cairns Corner USGS 7.5 Minute Quadrangle and within Sections 35 and 36, Township 20 South, Range 25 East, MDB&M.

Project Description:

The proposed Project includes the expansion of the existing 160-acre Woodville landfill by 240 acres; combined, the landfill would encompass an area of approximately 400 acres. The currently unused portion of the existing landfill is vacant, unproductive land, while the proposed Project expansion area is predominately under agriculturally productive row crops. The proposed Project is designed to anticipate and meet the demands/needs of increases in project solid waste disposal of the County for the next 55 years. It is anticipated that daily tonnage received, number of vehicles entering/exiting, landfill operations equipment, water usage, ancillary uses, etc., will not increase or decrease.

Potentially Significant Environmental Impact:

The Project's potentially significant environmental impacts include: Air Quality, Biological Resources, Cultural/Tribal Cultural Resources, Noise, and Traffic and Transportation. Mitigation Measures are included in the Draft EIR.
