Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The proposed project consists of two main components: (1) placing seven parcels comprised of approximately 2 acres (Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 0617-201-03 through 0617-201-09) into Federal trust; and (2) construction and operation of a gas station and convenience store on five of the seven APN Parcels (four parcels along Highway 62 and one along Utah Trail), as shown in Figure 4. The five APN Parcels to be developed under Alternative A are 0617-201-05, 0617-201-06, 0617-201-07, 0617-201-08, and 0617-201-09, and comprise approximately 1.46 acres.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures thatwould reduce or avoid that effect.

Potentially significant effects would result to land resources, water resources, air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, noise, and hazardous materials. Project design, BMPs, and mitigation measures would ensure less than significant effects. Project design, BMPs, and mitigation measures are described in detail in the Environmental Assessment and Finding of No Significant Impact. Mitigation measures include:

- Impelmentation of a design-level grading/drainage plan

- Compliance with EPS General Permit requirements, including the implementation of a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan

- Pre-construction nesting bird surveys if construction occurs during the nesting bird season

- Conducing limited shovel test pits and monitoring for cultural resources during construction

- Construction of an 8-foot tall solid masonry wall next to any residentially zoned land uses **continued**
