Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The cities of Marina, Monterey, Sand City and Seaside are proposing the Monterey Bay Opportunistic Beach Nourishment Program.

The proposed program is designed to facilitate sand placement in order to mitigate ongoing coastal erosion and the effects of future sea level rise, resulting in multi-objective long-term benefits with minimized short-term adverse effects. Under the proposed program, the cities would undertake multiple distinct sand placement activities as opportunistic sources become available and are determined compatible.

The project would potentially impact - air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, noise, tribal resources, . Mitigation measures have been proposed to reduce or avoid that effect:

- BIO-1b: General avoidance and minimization measures to biotic resources
- BIO-1c: Avoidance and minimization measures for special status plants
- BIO-1d: Avoidance and minimization measures for Smith's Blue Butterfly
- BIO-1e: Protective measures for Western Snowy Plover
- BIO-1f: Avoidance and minimization measures for nesting birds
- BIO-2: Avoid impacts to wetlands and waters
- CUL-1: Worker environmental awareness training (archaeology)
- CUL-2: Inadvertent discovery of cultural resources
- CUL-3: Cultural resources study of supplemental project sites
- CUL-4: Inadvertent discovery of human remains
- NOI-1: Limit duration of spreading activities near receptors
- TCR-1: Native American consultation
