PROJECT TITLE: Install Bike Lanes (or "Turnouts") - Southgate, Northgate, and Summit Roads

LOCATION: Mount Diablo State Park

COUNTY: Contra Costa

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: Install new paved bike turnouts/lanes and additional signs in approximately 77 locations along Northgate, Southgate, and Summit Roads at Mount Diablo State Park to enhance public safety. Work will:

At 31 locations along Southgate Road, 29 locations along Northgate Road and 17 locations along Summit Road:

- Grade existing spoils berms (from previous landslides) and use as fill or remove and store off-site;
- Remove one (1) 6" dbh Oak tree, up to eleven (11) ~6" bay trees, and one (1) stump and trim brush as needed:
- Place, where needed, additional dirt fill and/or road base to establish level areas for paving:
- Complete, as needed, drainage work to retain the original drainage at each location and move existing asphalt curbs;
- Pave (ashalt) road shoulders at the selected locations; and
- Move, as needed, existing signs and/or install new signs.
