**Project Title:** Larabee Creek Association Stream Crossing Project (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2018-0084-R1)

**Project Location (include county):** The project to be completed is located within the Little Larabee Creek watershed, approximately 2.6 miles west of the town of Blocksburg, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Section 24, T2S, R4E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Blocksburg U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 217-401-012; latitude 40.2767 N and longitude 123.6861 W.

**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2018-0084-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Mr. Thomas Richardson.

The project is limited to one encroachment. The proposed encroachment is to upgrade a failing and undersized culvert. Work for this encroachment will include excavation, removal of the failing culvert, replacement with a new properly sized culvert, backfilling and compaction of fill, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion.
