The Merrill Commerce Center Specific Plan (Project, Specific Plan) proposes development and operation of up to 7,014,000 square feet of high-cube fulfillment center warehouse uses and up to 1,441,000 square feet of business park uses (total of 8,455,000 square feet of development) on approximately 376.3 acres located in the City of Ontario, within San Bernardino County. The Project would also implement off-site infrastructure (roads, potable water, recycled water, sanitary sewer, storm drains, and fiber optic lines) necessary to support the Project.

The Project site is located along Merrill Avenue, between Grove Avenue and Carpenter Avenue. Eucalyptus Avenue forms the northerly boundary.
