**Project Location (include county):** The project is located at the Sacramento River and Sutter Bypass, in the County of Sutter, State of California; Sections 25, 26, 35, 36 of Township 14 N, Range 1 E, and Section 30 of Township 14 E of the Tisdale Weir USFS Survey 7.5 Quadrangle, Mt. Diablo Base & Meridian. APN's: 21-100-008 & 09, 110-001 & 002 & 023, 280-007 & 008, 290-001.

**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement EPIMS Notification Number SUT-16818-R2, pursuant to section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, the Department of Water Resources.

The project consists of rehabilitation and reconstruction of Tisdale Weir, installation of fish passage facilities, and project site improvements. Weir rehabilitation and reconstruction will focus on addressing documented structural and fish passage deficiencies of the existing weir. Actions will consist of repairing the weir crest and demolishing and reconstructing the two abutments (south and north) and the energy dissipation basin. The fish passage facilities will be coupled with the reconstruction of the integrated energy dissipation and fish collection basin on the downstream side of the weir; installation of a notch, an operable gate for flow regulation, and attendant facilities at the north end of the weir; along with construction of a channel connecting the notch in the weir to the Sacramento River.

This is to advise that CDFW, acting as a Responsible Agency, executed the above Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement on the date signed below and has made the following determinations regarding the project pursuant to California Code of Regulations section 15096, subdivision (i):
