Assuming plumbing, septic, drainage etc. In addition several cars and old trucks. nothing in report was mentioned about soil contaminations, metal remains etc.

Picture of southbound area of PP are inadequate and not represented as previous reports. Fence line of 7 and 5 Oakvue ct are not pictured at all in this report. Again showing the Pitch of PP land overlooking into back yard property.

The PP is not consistent with the existing neighborhood. 3/4 of houses adjacent are one story 1,200-2,000 One story not two story,

Air quality and light sources wil change with a negative impact.
