Project Description		

The Proposed Project is the implementation of a Natural Resources Management (NRM) Plan and an Interim Access (IA) Plan to incorporate the Coyote Canyon Property (Property) into the Coyote Lake-Harvey Bear Ranch County Park (Park) and to establish use of the Property as a public regional park.

Under the NRM Plan, the County of Santa Clara Parks and Recreation Department ("Department") would manage the 2,741-acre Property in accordance with Department guidelines and policies including, but not limited to, the Santa Clara County General Plan, Santa Clara County Parks 2018 Strategic Plan, and the Santa Clara Valley Habitat Plan. During evaluation of the Property for the NRM Plan, it was determined that the Property provides highly suitable habitat for sensitive plant and wildlife species and no major changes to the existing management regime were recommended. The Department would implement strategies that include surveys and monitoring, invasive plant control, wildfire fuel management, and rangeland management to protect and enhance the natural resources of the Property. Natural resources management goals, objectives and recommendations are provided in Section Four of the IA Plan and within the NRM Plan in Appendix C.

The IA Plan proposes the conversion of existing ranch roads to recreational trails, construction of new trails, and the long-term maintenance of a 10.4-mile trail network within the Project area. The IA Plan also identifies existing ranch roads that will serve as service roads to be used for Department operations and emergency vehicles. These service roads would be closed to the public. Trail improvements identified in the Plan include drainage improvements, installation of signs and benches, and trail resurfacing. Existing ranch roads that are in poor condition or are unsuitable for conversion to trails may be decommissioned.

Public access to the Property would be consistent with the Santa Clara County General Plan, the Santa Clara County Countywide Trails Master Plan, the Santa Clara County Uniform Interjurisdictional Trail Design Use and Management Guidelines, and the Santa Clara County Parks Trail Maintenance Manual and Best Management Practices.

Purpose of Notice

The County of Santa Clara, Parks and Recreation Department ("Department") is recirculating the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) for the Coyote Canyon Natural Resources Management Plan & Interim Access Plan ("Proposed Project"). The IS/MND for the Proposed Project was previously circulated for a 30-day public review period beginning April 30, 2019 and ending May 30, 2019 and was submitted to the California State Clearinghouse (SCH# 2019059009).

During the public review period, the San Francisco Regional Water Quality Board submitted a comment that identified additional potential permitting requirements for portions of trails that may occur in waters of the United States which fall within the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). Although the Department is not obligated to do so, it opted to recirculate a Draft Revised IS/MND for the Proposed Project for a 30-day public review period beginning on August 13, 2019 and ending September 13, 2019 to ensure that USACE has a full opportunity to comment on aspects of the Proposed Project that may implicate waters within USACE's jurisdiction.

Any person, agency, or entity may comment on the Draft Revised IS/MND in its entirety during this additional 30-day public review period. The County will respond to <u>both</u> comments received previously on the Draft IS/MND and any comments received on the Draft Revised IS/MND that is being recirculated.

The Department has also made several text edits to the IS/MND that are intended to clarify, amplify, or make minor modifications to these documents. The text edits in the First Amendment do not change any conclusions in the IS/MND or result in any new impacts.

Based on changes to the Draft Revised IS/MND, the Department has also made minor text edits to the Coyote Canyon Natural Resources Management Plan & Interim Access Plan for consistency with the Draft Revised IS/MND and to the Draft Revised Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP). The Revised Coyote Canyon Natural Resources Management Plan & Interim Access Plan and the revised MMRP are being circulated along with this Draft Revised IS/MND.

It should be noted that the adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration does not constitute approval of the project under consideration. The decision to approve or deny the project will be made separately. Review Period

The public review period for this document <u>begins Tuesday</u>, <u>August 13, 2019</u> and <u>ends Friday</u>, <u>September 13, 2019</u>. Public comments regarding the correctness, completeness, or adequacy of this Draft Revised Mitigated Negative Declaration are invited. Such comments should be based on specific environmental concerns. Basis for Mitigated Negative Declaration Recommendation

The Planning and Development Section of the Department of Parks and Recreation has reviewed the initial study for the project and, based upon substantial evidence in the record, <u>finds that although the proposed project could initially have a significant effect on the environment, there will not be a significant effect on the environment because of mitigation measures that have been incorporated into the project.</u>

This finding is based on the follow considerations (See Note below):

Based on the environmental evaluation presented in the Initial Study, the Project will not cause significant adverse effects related to aesthetics, air quality, agriculture and forestry resources, energy, geology/soils, greenhouse gas emissions, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, land use and planning, mineral resources, noise, population and housing, public services, recreation, transportation, tribal cultural resources, or utilities. In addition, the Project does not have any significant, unavoidable adverse impacts. The Project has incorporated implementation measures to avoid, reduce, or minimize the Project's effects on biological and cultural/historical/archaeological resources.

Mitigation measures are required for the following environmental impact areas: biological resources and cultural/historical/archaeological resources. Implementation of specified mitigation measures will avoid or reduce the effects of the Project on the environment and ensure that all impacts remain less-than-significant impacts. See the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration for a discussion of the potential impacts and those measures necessary to mitigate or avoid significant environmental impacts as a result of the implementation of the Project. These impacts and mitigation measures are identified in further detail in the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Plan (MMRP) and are summarized below.

MM BIO – 1

To avoid impacts to special-status plants, focused botanical surveys shall be completed for smooth lessingia and Loma Prieta hoita where new trails would be constructed. The Proposed Project is a covered activity under the Santa Clara Valley Habitat Plan (SCVHP), and surveys will be consistent with applicable requirements of the SCVHP.

MM BIO – 2

To avoid impacts to active nests of any protected birds, buffers will be clearly delineated or fenced by a qualified biologist or qualified staff from the Department's Natural Resources Program.

MM CUL - 1

In the event that prehistoric or historic-period cultural materials are unearthed during ground-disturbing activities, all work within 100-foot radius of the find shall halt and the Department will consult with a qualified archaeologist to evaluate the find and to determine its significance. The Department will comply with all Federal, State, local laws, and Department policies related to the protection of cultural resources.

MM CUL - 2

If human remains are encountered at the Project site during construction, there shall be no further excavation or disturbance of the site within a 200-foot radius of the location of such discovery, and any nearby area reasonably suspected to overlie adjacent remains. The Department will comply with provisions of Public Resources Code 5097.98 and all other applicable laws.

MM HYD - 1

The Proposed Project will comply with all conditions of applicable permits, as well as any additional avoidance and minimization requirements of the Santa Clara Valley Habitat Plan (SCVHP). Stream crossings will be consistent with implementation measures from Condition 4, Stream Avoidance and Minimization for In-Stream Projects, Condition 9, Prepare and Implement a Recreation Plan, and Table 6-2 of the SCVHP.

Note: A reporting or monitoring program must be adopted for measures to mitigate significant impacts at the time the Mitigated Negative Declaration is adopted, or the project is approved, in accordance with the requirements of Section 21081.6 of the Public Resources Codes.
