Discussion:

Wetland and Wetland Buffers:

The site contains no wetland habitats as defined by the San Diego County Resource Protection Ordinance. The site does not have a substratum of predominately undrained hydric soils, the land does not support, even periodically, hydric plants, nor does the site have a substratum that is non-soil and is saturated with water or covered by water at some time during the growing season of each year. Therefore, it has been found that the proposed project complies with Sections 86.604(a) and (b) of the Resource Protection Ordinance.

Floodways and Floodplain Fringe:

The project is in compliance. The project is approximately 1.4 miles from the nearest floodway/floodplain fringe area, but there are no proposals for any offsite uses or improvements that need compliance with the Resource Protection Ordinance.

Steep Slopes:

The average slope for the property is less than 25 percent gradient. Slopes with a gradient of 25 percent or greater and 50 feet or higher in vertical height are required to be placed in open space easements by the San Diego County Resource Protection Ordinance (RPO). There are no steep slopes on the property. Additionally, the land has been substantially disturbed by previous legal grading. Therefore, it has been found that the proposed project complies with Sections 86.604(e) of the RPO.

Sensitive Habitats:

The project site is developed and no sensitive habitat lands exist on the project site. Therefore, it has been found that the proposed project complies with Section 86.604(f) of the RPO.

Significant Prehistoric and Historic Sites:

County staff has reviewed the information available in the Geotechnical Investigation by Geocon as well as County records and it has been determined that archaeological/historic resources will not be disturbed, and mitigation would not be required. Therefore, it has been found that the proposed project complies with Section 86.604(g) of the RPO.

Discussion:

The project Storm Water Quality Management Plan, prepared by Hunsaker and Associates San Diego, Inc has been reviewed and is found to be complete and in compliance with the WPO.

Discussion:

County staff has reviewed the Noise Assessment prepared by Ldn Consulting, Inc. It has been determined the proposal would not comply with the County of San Diego 65 dBA CNEL exterior noise standard and may exceed the 60 dBA CNEL interior noise standard without mitigation. However, mitigation is required in the form of six (6) foot high noise barriers for the exterior noise generated from the adjacent roadways and prior to the issuance of a building permit, an interior noise study is required for the project. The interior noise study would assess the interior noise levels and require conformance to County standards prior to building permit issuance. Additionally, construction noise and direct off-site noise would not exceed County of San Diego noise thresholds. Therefore the project would not expose people to, nor generate potentially significant noise levels which exceed the allowable limits of the County of San Diego Noise Element of the General Plan, County of San Diego Noise Ordinance, and other applicable local, State, and Federal noise control regulations.
