The proposed Project is the implementation of a General Development P (RMP), which provides guidance on overall future park development and Regional Park. The GDP proposes improvements in seven areas of the park these include improvements to existing trails and parking, and developments to long-term guidance on park resource management.	resource management at Peters Canyon park to enhance public access and recreation.

Mitigation measures to reduce potentially significant impacts are provided for biological resources, cultural resources, geology, paleontology, and tribal cultural resources.

Mitigation measures for biology include conducting focused rare plant surveys and flagging for avoidance; performing nesting bird surveys and determining if buffers are required for active nests; providing environmental awareness training to Project personnel; and conducting a field survey for a new water line so that the alignment has the least impacts to existing vegetation.

For cultural resources, the mitigation measures provided include having an archaeological monitor present during all ground-disturbing activities associated with park improvements; and halting work in the vicinity of a find if human remains are discovered and contacting the County coroner.

The geological mitigation measure includes conducting a geological study prior to approval of final plans, when appropriate; and the paleontological mitigation measures include preparing a mitigation and monitoring plan, outlining procedures for a Worker Environmental Awareness Program, and conducting paleontological monitoring in areas of high sensitivity.

For tribal cultural resources, if unanticipated archaeological resources are found work will halt in a 50-foot radius and the County will coordinate with the Tribe if the resource is determined to be Native American in origin.
