Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) proposes to construct a new maintenance facility, in the City of Fontana. This facility would be built adjacent to and east of the Caltrans Southern Regional Laboratory (SRL), located at 13970 Victoria Street, Fontana, CA 92336, and the Inland Empire Transportation Management Center (IETMC) at 13892 Victoria Street. The project site is approximately 15 acres in area. The northern portion (about 6.0 acres) is currently used as a renewable energy (solar panel) farm. The new maintenance facility would use 6.6 acres of the southern portion. The remainder of land would be reserved for future development.

The proposed maintenance facility would include office space for roadway and maintenance crews and would have a room specifically for the Southern California Regional Disaster Coordination Center for Transportation (SCRDCCT). This maintenance facility would also include a separate shop/storage structure, fuel stations, a back-up generator and other transportation/maintenance components.
