If vegetation removal is necessary during the breeding season, a qualified biologist will conduct pre-construction surveys for birds no more than 3 days prior to construction activities.

BIO 2 - Comply with Executive Order Number 13112: Invasive Species. Vegetation species known to be invasive in the state of California will not be installed (e.g. Mexican fan palm, pampas grass, tree of heaven, etc.). BIO-3 – Biologist must be invited to all construction kickoff and pre-construction meetings.
