Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The project location is through downtown Gualala, at the southern end of Mendocino county between Post Miles (PM) 0.6 and PM 1.0. The proposed project would include a 12-foot wide two-way, left turn lane, with two 11-foot-wide through lanes and Class II, five-foot-wide bicycle lanes in each direction. Six-foot-wide sidewalks winding through an eight-foot-wide right-of-way are proposed on both sides to accommodate pedestrian traffic. Five new mainline crosswalks and three new side road crosswalks are proposed. Three median islands are included for pedestrian refuges at crosswalk locations. The median islands would be rolled-curb, low profile (mountable for emergency vehicles), and hardscaped. All sidewalk ramps and features would conform to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. A radar speed feedback sign would be placed facing southbound traffic at PM 0.94, immediately south of the intersection with Ocean Avenue, at the bottom of the hill.
