Project Title: Temple Seep Well Installation (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2019-0372-R1)

Project Location (include county): Trinity River, tributary to Klamath River; in Trinity County on Assessor's Parcel Number 025-310-17-00 near the community of Douglas City.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2019-0372-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Kirby Temple.

The project is limited to replacement of an existing seep well and the diversion of water from the Trinity River to provide domestic water supply to a home on the legal parcel recognized as 025-310-17-00. Additionally, the project includes the diversion of water from underflow of the Trinity River, pursuant to a riparian basis of claim. The edge of the new well, including excavation, shall be no closer than 25 feet to the edge of the water level at the time of construction.

Exempt Status:

Statutory Exemption.

Categorical Exemption. Type – Class 2 California Code of Regulations, title 14, section 15302 (c) Replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure replaced, (c) Replacement or reconstruction of existing utility systems and/or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of capacity.

Reasons why project is exempt: The project is limited to construction of a new seep well to serve a single-family residence and will replace a former diversion that is no longer adequate. The project will not result in impacts with regards to an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern, nor will it place new impacts in an area with unique or unusual circumstances.
