Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

A SITE DEVELOPMENT PERMIT (SDP) and COASTAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT (CDP) to allow for the replacement of a failing 18-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe (RCP) storm drain with a new 42-inch diameter RCP segment at the North Course of the Torrey Pines Golf Course. The existing 18-inch RCP storm drain pipe would be removed and a new 360 foot segment of a 42-inch RCP would be installed. The site is located in the OP-1-1 zone, the Coastal Overlay Zone (Coastal Commission Jurisdiction), the Coastal Height Limit Overlay Zone, the Beach Impact Area of the Parking Impact Overlay Zone, the Campus Impact Area of the Parking Impact Overlay Zone, the Residential Tandem Parking Overlay Zone, the University Community Plan area, and lies between the First Public Roadway and the shoreline.
