Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of the Project:

The Sierra Nevada Conservancy would provide funding to the U.S. Forest Service, Eldorado National Forest to complete forest fuel reduction activities in areas affected by the 2014 King Fire. This project includes forest fuel reduction, including the management of shrubs and dead trees. Project activities would involve mechanical and chemical treatments including skidding and piling of large material; mastication or piling of small material; shrub control; and biomass utilization. These activities will reduce the risk of high severity wildfire and support forest restoration on the Eldorado National Forest, promoting forest health and resiliency during future wildfire events.

Reasons why project is exempt:

CEQA does not apply to prescribed fire, thinning, or fuel reduction projects undertaken on federal lands to reduce the risk of high-severity wildfire that have been reviewed under the federal NEPA if the primary role of a state or local agency is providing funding or staffing for those projects. SNC would provide funding to the U.S. Forest Service to reduce forest fuels on federal land in the Eldorado National Forest. The project activities have been analyzed by the U.S. Forest Service pursuant to NEPA. A NEPA Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) was prepared for the project and a Record of Decision was signed by the Eldorado National Forest on September 2, 2015. Proposed project activities were evaluated in the NEPA EIS (see Attachment: King Fire EIS Fuels Treatment Vicinity Map).
