**Project Title:** Warlick Stream Remediation and Bank Stabilization Project (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. 1600-2019-0669-R1)

**Project Location (include county):** The project to be completed is located within the Jacoby Creek watershed, approximately 2 miles south/southeast of the town of Arcata, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Section 9, T5N, R1E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Arcata South U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 501-081-015; latitude 40.8370 N and longitude 124.0682 W.

**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2019-0669-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Mr. Tim Warlick.

The project is limited to one encroachment on Jacoby Creek. The proposed encroachment is to remove concrete and associated debris from the bank of Jacoby Creek. The debris was placed approximately eight (8) feet thick and 120 feet in length. The placement of debris was conducted as a form of bank protection, but this material violates Fish and Game Codes (FGC) 1602, 5650, and 5652, and needs to be removed. Work for this encroachment will include excavation, removal of the concrete debris, replacement of this debris with a properly sized rock slope protection as necessary to minimize erosion.

**Exempt Status:**

**Reasons why project is exempt:** The proposed encroachment is to remove concrete and associated debris from the bank of Jacoby Creek. Work for this encroachment will include excavation, removal of the concrete debris, replacement of this debris with a properly sized rock slope protection as necessary to minimize erosion. There would be no significant adverse impact on endangered, rare or threatened species or their habitat pursuant to section 15065. There are no hazardous materials at or around the project site that may be disturbed or removed. The project will not result in impacts that are significant when viewed in connection with the effects of past projects, the effects of other current projects, and the effects of probable future projects.
