Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The Project Applicant intends to construct and operate a 20-acre industrial center that will house various industrial uses allowable by the zone district, including cannabis cultivation, manufacturing, and distribution which is allowable with a Conditional Use Permit. Project components include:

- Constructing and operating an industrial park with buildings ranging from 5,100 to 27,500 square feet each, for a total of up to 335,000 square feet of industrial space.
- Constructing internal access roads, parking spaces and associated landscaping.
- Connecting the Project to the existing City water, wastewater, and stormdrain systems.
- Installation of perimeter security, including lighting and an alarm system, in accordance with Chapter 5.48 of the Woodlake Municipal Code.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

Cultural Resources: While no historic resources were discovered during the investigations, subsurface construction activities associated with the proposed Project could potentially damage or destroy previously undiscovered historic resources. This is considered a potentially significant impact; however, implementation of Mitigation Measure CUL-1 and CLU-2 will ensure that significant impacts remain less than significant with mitigation incorporation. Mitigation includes worker education, construction monitoring by the construction supervisor, and stopping all construction and contacting authorities in the event of uncovered resources.

Biological Resources: Mitigation measures, including surveys and take avoidance, will be implemented to prevent significant impacts to migratory birds, San Joaquin Kit Fox and Crotch Bumble Bee.

Traffic: The Project shall be responsible for paying its fair share cost percentages and/or constructing improvements as detailed in Table 3.11 in the EIR, subject to reimbursement for the costs that are in excess of the Project's equitable responsibility as determined by the City of Woodlake. This shall be itemized and enforced through conditions of approval or a development agreement, at the discretion of the City of Woodlake.
